



RESOLUTION NO. 449

A RESOLUTION SUGGESTING THAT THE ANNA MARIA ISLAND FIRE CONTROL DISTRICT BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS HOLD A REFERENDUM ON THE SUBJECT OF THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW, CENTRALLY LOCATED FIRE STATION.

WHEREAS, the citizens of the City of Anna Maria have voiced their opinions, both pro and con, about the construction of a new fire station for the Anna Maria Island Fire Control District to be located in Holmes Beach; and

WHEREAS, it is felt that the "S" curve on Gulf Drive in Holmes Beach is a very dangerous location for the proposed "centrally located" fire station; and

WHEREAS, even though we realize that your Board of Commissioners, by an Act of the Florida Legislature, is entrusted with the safety and welfare of the residents of the Anna Maria Island Fire Control District; we feel our citizens should be given an opportunity to make their positions known;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF ANNA MARIA, FLORIDA, DULY ASSEMBLED, THAT:

The members of the Anna Maria City Commission respectfully suggest that the Board of Commissioners of the Anna Maria Island Fire Control District hold a referendum on the plans to construct a new, centrally located fire station for all of the electors residing within the Anna Maria Island Fire Control District.
