claims resulting from such action.

 - (6) A signed statement of how basic living expenses (i.e., food, shelter, and transportation) are being provided if household income is less than 50% of the current Federal Poverty Guidelines and no one in the household is receiving Food Stamps.
- 5. <u>ATTACHMENT III</u>, Budget Summary, is hereby replaced with the revised <u>ATTACHMENT III</u>, Budget Summary, attached hereto.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION CONTINUED:

- The Emergency Home Energy Assistance for the Elderly Program (EHEAP) is funded through the West Central Florida Area Agency on Aging, Inc. and assists low-income households with at least one person 60 years of age or older, who are experiencing a home energy emergency.
- The program allows for assistance once during the heating season and once during the cooling season through an application process.
- January 27, 2006, BCC gave authorization to allow the Community Services Department to take over the responsibilities
 of the Emergency Home Energy Assistance Program as requested by the West Central Florida Area Agency on Aging,
 Inc.
- March 16, 2010 the board approved the 2010/2011 Emergency Home Energy Assistance Program Agreement with the effective dates of April 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011.
- The Department of Community Affairs decreased the contract amount in May 2010 in order to release only first quarter funding.
- Amendment #2 reflects the remainder of the original contract funds.
- Amendment #2 increases the agreement by \$67,576 and replaces the budget summary.
- The execution of Amendment #2 will allow for electric payment assistance to the elderly in the county.
