

RESOLUTION R-17-007

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MANATEE COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE 2013/14, 2014/15, 2015/16 and 2016/17 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) ANNUAL ACTION PLANS

WHEREAS, on July 30, 2013, the Board approved Resolution R-13-106, adopting the Community Development Block Grant 2013/14

WHEREAS, on June 17, 2014, the Board approved Resolution R-14-067, adopting the Community Development Block Grant 2014/15 Annual Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, on June 16, 2015, the Board approved Resolution R-15-085, adopting the Community Development Block Grant 2015/16 Annual Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, on June 21, 2016, the Board approved Resolution R-16-094, adopting the Community Development Block Grant 2016/17 Annual Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, Resolutions R-13-106, R-14-067, R-15-085 and R-16-094 approved specific CDBG, HOME, and ESG activities; and

WHEREAS, this substantial amendment reallocates a portion of CDBG funding from the 2013/14, 2014/15, 2015/16 and 2016/17 Action Plans; and

WHEREAS, the process for amending a Consolidated Plan and/or Annual Action Plan is outlined in Manatee County's Citizen Participation Plan and each of those steps have been followed in this process, to include a 30-day public comment period.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners that:

1. Resolution R-17-007 is hereby adopted to provide for an amendment to the 2013/14, 2014/15, 2015/16, and 2016/17 Annual Action Plans as attached hereto.
2. The County Administrator, or designee, is hereby authorized to approve and execute subrecipient funding agreements, amendments, and associated standard Land Use and Deed Restriction Agreements, and, authorize payments up to the maximum allowable funding for Federal CDBG, ESG, and HOME program activities as approved and adopted by the Board of County Commissioners in Manatee County's Consolidated Plan and Annual Action Plans.

Manatee County Notice of Proposed Substantial Amendment 2013/14, 2014/15, 2015/16, and 2016/17 Annual Action Plans Activities

In accordance with its Citizen Participation Plan and US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) regulations, Manatee County is notifying the public of proposed changes to activities found in the 2013/14, 2014/15, 2015/16 and 2016/17 Annual Action Plans. Affected activities are funded with Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds.

The proposed substantial amendment will:

1. Increase the 13/14 Manatee County Clerk of the Circuit Court W.H. Vanderipe House activity by \$38,000.00; and
2. Increase the 14/15 12th Street East Sidewalk activity by \$197,261.00; and
3. Reallocate \$63,261.00 of 14/15 CDBG funding from various projects completed under budget to fund/increase budgets for 2013/14, 2014/15, and 2016/17 CDBG activities; and
4. Decrease the 14/15 CDBG 21st Street East Sidewalk activity by \$50,000.00; and
5. Decrease the 15/16 CDBG Program Administration budget by \$14,126.00; and
6. Cancel the 16/17 CDBG AMFM Enterprise, Inc. – Sara's Place Empowerment Center - Transportation activity for \$49,999.00; and
7. Cancel the 16/17 CDBG 15th Street East Sidewalk activity for \$122,000.00; and
8. Add a new 16/17 CDBG AMFM Enterprise, Inc. – Sara's Place Empowerment Center – Client Services activity in the amount of \$64,125.00.

RESOLUTION B-17-028
AMENDING THE ANNUAL BUDGET
FOR MANATEE COUNTY, FLORIDA
FOR FISCAL YEAR 2016-2017

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes 129.06, authorizes the Board of County Commissioners to amend its budget for the current fiscal year as follows:

- a) Appropriations for expenditures in any fund may be decreased and other appropriations in the same fund correspondingly increased, provided the total appropriations of the fund are not
- b) Appropriations from reserves may be made to increase the appropriation for any particular expense in the same fund, or to create an appropriation in the fund for any lawful purpose.
- c) Unanticipated revenues, including increased receipts for enterprise or proprietary funds, may be appropriated for their intended purpose, and may be transferred between funds to properly account for the unanticipated revenue.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Manatee County, Florida that the 2016-2017 budget is hereby amended in accordance with FS 129.06 as described on the attached summary and specified in the budget adjustment batch files which are listed below:

Department: REDEVELOPMENT AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY
Fund: CDBG GRANT FUND
Fund: CDBG/HOME CAPITAL PROJECTS
Description: Deappropriates \$236,125 CDBG grant funding from the following: \$50,000, CDBG FY14/15; \$14,126, CDBG FY15/16; and \$171,999, CDBG FY16/17 Action Plan grants and reappropriates as follows: \$38,000, CDBG FY14/15 MC Clerk of Court Vanderipe; \$12,000, CDBG FY14/15 12th Street East Sidewalk; \$14,126, FY15/16 AM/FM Enterprise Client; \$49,999, FY16/17 AM/FM Enterprise Client; and \$122,000, FY16/17 12th Street East Sidewalk. Also appropriates \$63,261 prior deappropriated CDBG grant funds to the CDBG FY14/15 12th Street East Sidewalk project. All changes are listed in the Substantial Amendment being presented to the Board along with this budget amendment.

Manatee County Citizen Participation Plan

Background Discussion

- Manatee County is an entitlement community for the Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG) and receives funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.
- In order to receive HUD funding, the County must have an approved 5-Year Consolidated Plan, and an approved Annual Action Plan for each of the 5 years that funding will be received. The 2012-17 Consolidated Plan was approved on June 5, 2012.
- Over the past several years, the Board of County Commissioners has approved the following CDBG Annual Action Plans:
 - 2013/14 Action Plan on July 30, 2013 – Resolution R-13-106
 - 2014/15 Action Plan on June 17, 2014 – Resolution R-14-067

- 2015/16 Action Plan on June 16, 2015 – Resolution R-15-085
- 2016/17 Action Plan on June 21, 2016 – Resolution R-16-094
- A substantial amendment to the above referenced Action Plans is necessary to change previously approved CDBG activities/budgets as follows:
 - Manatee County Clerk of the Circuit Court W.H. Vanderipe House Historical Restoration Project – original budget \$49,500, revised budget \$87,500. The Clerk’s Office spent a couple of years working with a consultant on a restoration plan. Once the plan was completed, a small construction project was put out to bid on two different occasions, to expend the balance of the grant. Although several prospective bidders attended the information conference, no bids were received. Upon discussions with prospective bidders, it was determined that the scope of the project was too small. The budget is being increased to expand the scope of the construction project.
 - 12th Street East Sidewalk Project – It has been approximately two years since this project received grant funding. As of December 2016, construction drawings are 100% complete. In the interim period, additional work was identified during the design phase and construction costs have almost doubled from the cost estimate that was provided with the grant application over two years ago. The budget is being increased from \$210,000 to \$407,261 so that the County can proceed to the construction phase of the project.
 - \$63,261 of funding from various projects completed under budget is being used to provide additional funding for projects in this amendment.
 - 21st Street East Sidewalk Project – This project was completed under budget. Funding for this project is being decreased by \$50,000 to fund other projects in this amendment.
 - 15/16 CDBG Administration – This budget is being reduced by \$14,126 because of a position vacancy, and a lower than expected administrative cost needed to support the CDBG program during this fiscal period. The \$14,126 will go toward the Sara’s Place Empowerment Center Client Services Activity discussed below.
 - 15th Street East Sidewalk Project – This project was approved in the 16/17 Action Plan. Due to budget shortfalls, this project is being cancelled for activity this year, with the funding going toward projects in this amendment. However, this project will be reconsidered for funding in the next funding cycle.
 - The 16/17 AMFM Enterprise, Inc., Sara’s Place Empowerment Center Transportation activity is being canceled and the new 16/17 AMFM Enterprise, Inc., Sara’s Place Empowerment Center Client Services activity is now being added. The County received two grant applications from the above non-profit agency and chose to award the transportation activity only. Since this is a new service, the non-profit agency has requested that funding be swapped out to the client services activity to get the service up and running. AMFM Enterprise, Inc., is currently not serving enough clients to warrant the purchase of a bus.

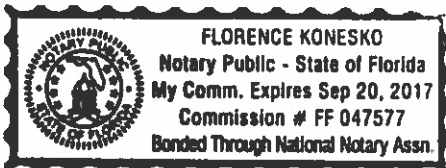

"We raised less than that and were still able to accomplish it," Ramirez said.

Presents were piled in the empty halls of the middle school and loaded into a caravan. The first stop on their list was a vacant lot behind K&S Discount Food & Beverages on 301 Boulevard East, where underneath the cover of tall oak trees is a homeless camp with spo-

radic chairs and living room sets.

A few homeless people walked up with smiles to the girls bearing presents, including a man named Jayson.

He said he has been homeless for six months after being in prison for 10 years and not being able to successfully immerse himself back into society.

"I don't see it forever," he said. "We look out for

each other."

Larry and Dawn were homeless in Manatee County for 10 years until they were able to just recently get housing. Now, they try to help others who are going through homelessness.

"It's awesome," Larry said of the girls' project. "There ain't nobody out here around that does this for people."

imposed in 2011, felons have to wait a minimum of five years after completing their sentence before applying to demonstrate they won't re-offend. Felons convicted of violent offenses and other serious crimes must wait seven years before asking to have their civil rights restored.

Florida law gives the governor "broad discretion over who may vote," Wood wrote, because the law requires that the governor must vote in favor, along with a majority of the Cabinet, for a felon's civil rights to be restored.

The governor also has the power to draft rules

for the restoration of civil rights. Applications were approved. Florida has averaged fewer than 500 approved applications each year since, the report found.

"Silencing 1.6 million voices is precisely the opposite of what democracy looks like," Pamela Goodman, president of the League of Women Voters of Florida, said in a statement through the Brennan Center. "These are citizens who have paid their debt to society, and have a second chance. They are living and working in communities across

the Sunshine State. Just like everyone else, they should be able to have input on decisions that will impact them every day."

Two efforts are under way to put constitutional amendments on the 2018 ballot that would change Florida's law and automatically restore civil rights for most felons who complete the terms of their sentence. Felons convicted of murder or sexual offenses would still have to go before the clemency board.

Floridians for a Fair Democracy petitioned the Florida Supreme Court this fall to review its proposed constitutional

amendment. The court scheduled a hearing for March to hear arguments on the initiative, the News Service of Florida reported this month.

Separately, Lake Worth Democratic Sen. Jeff Clemens is also trying to get the Florida Legislature to place a similar constitutional amendment on the 2018 ballot. He filed a joint resolution (SJR 74) for lawmakers to consider in the 2017 session, which begins in March. No House version has been filed yet.

Wood contrasts the policies of Scott with those of his predecessor, then-Republican Gov. Charlie Crist. In 2007, Crist allowed for automatic restoration of rights for people with nonviolent felony convictions, among other changes.

Scott's "more restrictive" rules and "more burdensome" application process caused the number of restoration-of-rights cases to "plummet" by comparison, the report found.

In 2009, under Crist, 24,537 people were approved for rights restoration, whereas in 2011, under Scott, only 52 appli-

cations were approved. Florida has averaged fewer than 500 approved applications each year since, the report found.

"Silencing 1.6 million voices is precisely the opposite of what democracy looks like," Pamela Goodman, president of the League of Women Voters of Florida, said in a statement through the Brennan Center. "These are citizens who have paid their debt to society, and have a second chance. They are living and working in communities across
