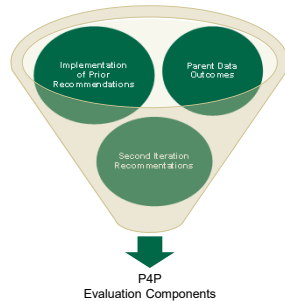

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Sampling and Data Collection

Component 1	Component 2
- Evaluated parent demographics and program satisfaction rates - Sample included all parents with cases in Sarasota or Manatee counties with active enrollment in NAMI P4P between January 1, 2025, and December 1, 2025.	- Assessed parent outcomes relative to program engagement. - Sample included all Sarasota/Manatee parents with any prior or active enrollment in NAMI P4P (i.e., data from December 2022 to December 2025).

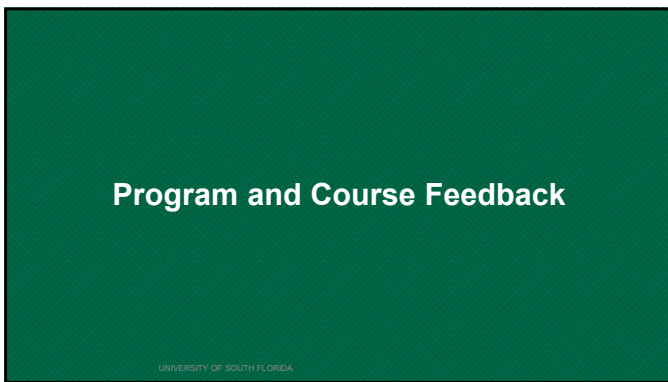

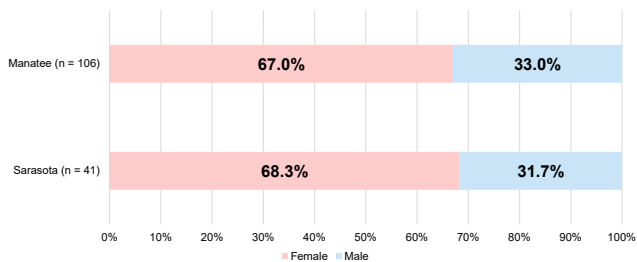

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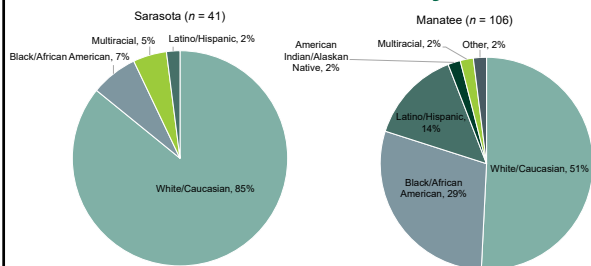
Sex Distributions



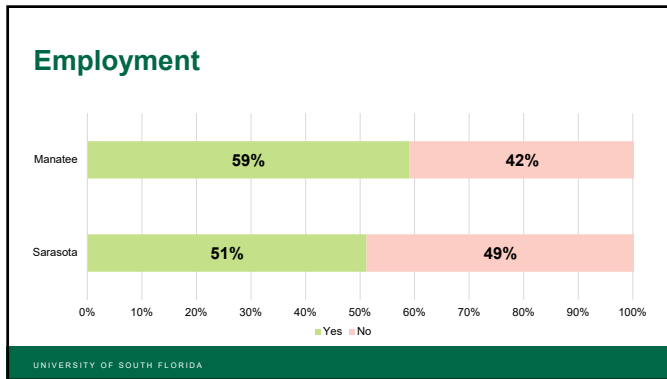
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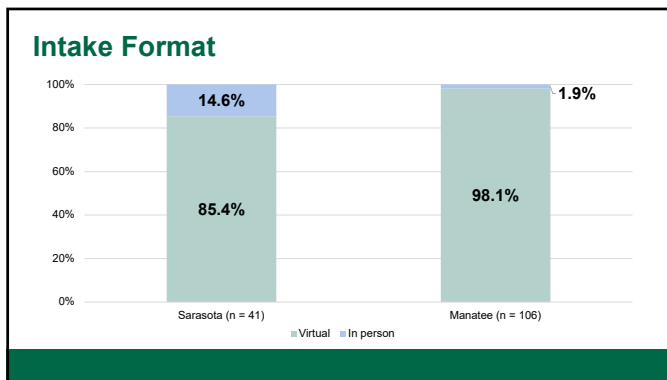
Race & Ethnicity



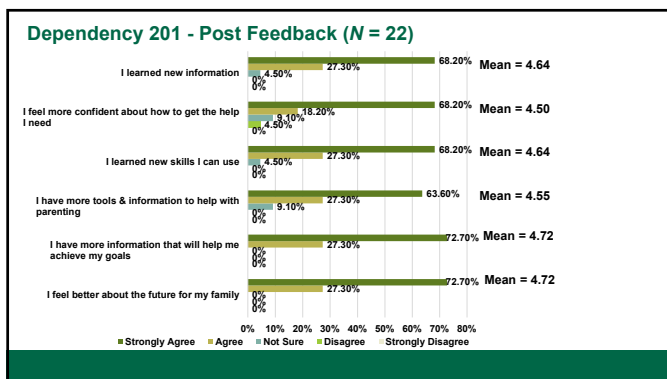
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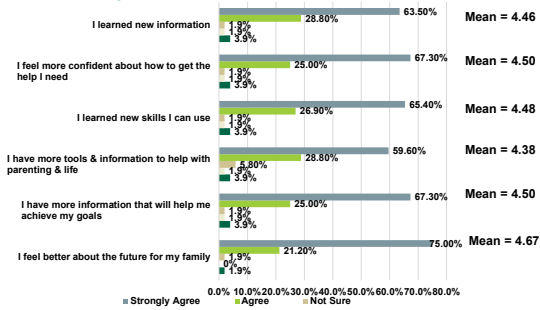


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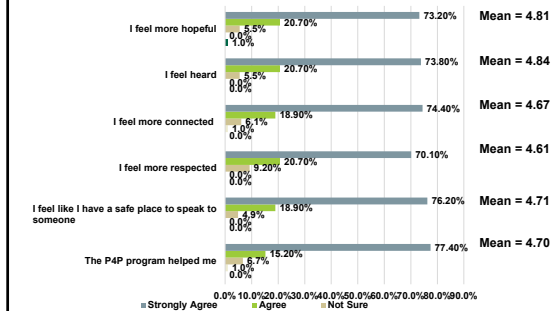
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Dependency 301 - Post Feedback (N = 52)
