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Whereas, it appears therefrom and is known to this Board that the streets of said plats have never been laid out, opened up or used, and have never been adopted by this Board or any other Governmental authority as roads or streets, and

Whereas, it is known to this Board that said lands are farm, grove and pasture lands and in no sense municipal or suburban property, and no good purpose is served by a continuation of said plats.

Now therefore be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Manatee County, Florida:

First: That the plats known as No. 1 Town of Fleming, as recorded in Plat Book No. 1 at page 94: No. 2, Towns of Fleming recorded in Plat Book No. 1 at page 112, and Tamiami Farms, recorded in Plat Book No. 5 at page 9 of Manatee County Records, should be and the same are hereby abrogated and cancelled.

Second: That all the several streets, alleys and easements dedicated or offered for dedication by said several plats, should be and the same are hereby vacated, closed and abandoned and declared to be free from any claim on behalf of the public.

Third: That nothing herein contained shall ever be construed or attempting to close and open public road on, over or through the lands involved in said plats or any part thereof.

On motion of Mr. Young duly seconded and carried by vote of the Board said resolution was unanimously passed and adopted.

Whereas it appeared that Lots 5 and 6 less N 105 ft of Blk 15 Fairview Park and Lot 8 Nev Long Beach

were sold for the taxes of 1926 and when redeemed by Miss Agnes Hudson the Clerk charged the taxes of 1927, and the said Miss Agnes Hudson produces Tax Receipt No 7159 dated Jul 31, 1928 showing the payment of taxes for the year 1927 on said above described lands, therefore upon motion of Mr. Young duly seconded and carried by vote of the Board it was ordered that the County part of said taxes be refunded to Miss Agnes Hudson in the sum of \$19.28.

Mr. W. J. Walker then presented request for reduction of personal property taxes on contents of Bradeno Hotel and after consideration the clerk was ordered to notify Mr. Walker that the Board was without authority in the matter.

A bill in the sum of \$20.33 was presented by Thompson & Son of Oneco for supplies furnished to A. F. Howell who was in destitute circumstances and on motion of Mr. Curry duly seconded and carried by vote of the Board said bill was ordered paid and said Thomson & Son were directed to furnish said Howell with supplies not to exceed \$25.00 and this Board would pay same

Application of Mrs Odie J. Wilson for Mothers Pension was filed and being in proper form on motion of Mr. Parrish duly seconded and carried by vote of the board same was approved and Mrs. Wilson put on Mothers Pension fund.

Application for Mothers Pension of Mrs. Hortense Beville was rejected.

Mr. Curry then presented bills to the amount of \$881.24 which were approved on motion of Mr. Parrish duly seconded and carried by vote of the Board it was ordered that H. A. Jacocks repair windows in County Jail for \$24.75

the Board then adjourned to meet Tuesday April 7, 1931, at 10.30 A. M

Board met pursuant to adjournment, present and presiding Hon. J. P. Harllee, Chairman, also present C. W. Parrish, J. H. Young and Whitney Curry members of said Board, J. P. Davids Sheriff and Robt. H. Roesch, Clerk

Meeting was opened by proclamation of the Sheriff.

A bill of \$7.50 was presented by M. B. Coarsey and on motion Mr. Young duly seconded and carried by vote of the Board was ordered paid, from Agriculture Fund.

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Mr. J. P. Davidson, Sheriff of Manatee County then asked the Board to give him a certificate of indebtedness for fees earned by said Sheriff and unpaid and on motion of Mr. Parrish duly seconded and carried by vote of the Board the Clerk was ordered to prepare a certificate of indebtedness in the sum of \$4000.00 in favor of J. P. Davidson, payable when funds are available for said purpose and without interest.

It appearing that One J. A. Owen in on the Manatee County pauper list and it appears that said Owen is able to get along without County assistance therefor on motion of Mr. Parrish duly seconded and carried by vote of the Board said J. A. Owen was ordered stricken from County pauper pension list.

The Board then took up the matter of County paupers and the expenses thereof and after careful consideration of same it was ordered that all County pauper pensions be cut 25% to take effect immediately.

There not being money enough in the Mothers Pension fund to pay a full month pension the Clerk was ordered to pay said Mothers pension in the sum of 50% of amount allowed each pensioner.

On motion of Mr. Curry duly seconded and carried by vote of the Board in was ordered that the sum of \$250.00 be appropriated to the Florida Agricultural Tariff Association and that the Clerk draw warrant for \$100.00 now and later a warrant in the sum of \$150.00 for said purpose.

The Board having appropriated the sum of \$2000.00 to Sunniland Council Boy Scouts of America and application having been made for help in the matter on motion of Mr. Young, duly seconded and carried by vote of the Board the Clerk was ordered to draw warrant in the sum of \$300.00 for said Boy Scouts.

The Board then took up the bill for the repairs of the County Health Department car and after due consideration the Board agreed to pay for the Tire & Tube and painting of said car in the sum of \$52.50.

The Board then took up the matter of the salary of J. J. Sherley, Janitor and after discussion thereof and on motion of Mr. Parrish duly seconded and carried by vote of the Board said salary was cut to \$115.00 per month to take effect May, 1, 1931.

No further business appearing and the following accounts having been examined, found correct, were approved and the Clerk was ordered to draw warrants for same, said accounts aggregating as follows:
