

May 2, 1960

The Board of County Commissioners of Manatee County, Florida, met in Regular Session in the Court House in Bradenton, Florida, Monday, May 2nd, 1960 at 9:30 a.m.

Present were Commissioners John G. Jones, H. C. Slaughter, Irwin Klemmer, Elmer Bustle and Tom W. Jennings, Deputy Clerk Bruce M. Cox and County Attorney George H. Harrison.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Slaughter.

Minutes of the meeting of April 18, 1960 were read. The chairman stated that if there were no alterations, corrections or additions the Minutes would stand approved as read.

ACCESS ROAD - GREGORY ESTATES (34TH AVENUE EXTENSION)
NO REPORT ON NEGOTIATION FOR RIGHT OF WAY

Sam Kessler, resident of Gregory Estates (36th Avenue and 18th Street W.), asked if the Board had received a report from the County Engineer as to providing access road from Gregory Estates to the Tamiami Trail (extension of 34th Avenue).

John Benson, Jr., County Engineer, explained that extension of 34th Avenue West to the Tamiami Trail (U.S. 41) was not feasible, and that he had been unable to contact Nicholas Monaco, agent for the Catholic Church, relative to negotiation with the Church for right of way to 30th Avenue.

COMPLAINT OF TRAFFIC HAZARD 38TH STREET REFERRED TO COMMISSIONER KLEMMER

The complaint regarding traffic hazard at 14th Street and 38th Avenue, caused by concrete abutments placed by the J.E. Hughes Agency, was referred to Commissioner Klemmer. (Traffic "mushrooms" placed on the property of the Agency to prevent motorists from cutting into private property in turning into narrow road.)

J. O. Mason, 1910 34th Avenue (Gregory Estates), complained about the narrow roads in Gregory Estates (with ditches on right side) and 38th Avenue the only access into the subdivision. The Commissioners explained that attempt was now being made to get connection between 34th and 30th Avenues, also study of possibility of right of way into Cortez Road.

THEODORE, JOHN RE-ADMITTED AS COUNTY PATIENT TO TB HOSPITAL
COUNTY PATIENT RATE RETROACTIVE TO 1955

Bruce M. Cox, Deputy Clerk, explained the status of JOHN THEODORE, who had been admitted as a non-resident patient to the State Tuberculosis Hospital in 1955, stating

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that if this patient was now re-admitted as a county resident the hospital rate for such patient would become retroactive to 1955 and credit would be given to the old account. This transaction would in no way obligate the county for payment of hospitalization accumulated under the non-resident rate as the Social Security check of Mr. Theodore will be credited first against current hospitalization, the balance of the check against the old account. (Mr. Theodore had been admitted, by special application approved by the Board, to the hospital as county resident, in November, 1957.)

Upon motion by Mr. Jennings, seconded by Mr. Bustle, the application of JOHN THEODORE to enter the State Tuberculosis Hospital, as a county resident, was approved.

RESOLUTION TO STATE BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION (RE WITHHOLDING SURPLUS GAS TAX FUNDS)
ACKNOWLEDGED RECEIVED

George Harrison, County Attorney, advised that he had been notified that the resolution authorizing the State Board of Administration to withhold funds from 20% Gas Tax surplus for payment of principal and interest on \$1,100,000. Certificates of Indebtedness had been received and it was sufficient for the purpose intended.

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REPORT ON 26TH STREET, 57TH AVENUE & SAUNDERS ROAD

Mr. Klemmer reported on conference with the County Engineer and the chairman of the Board regarding certain projects in his district, and he had been assured that 57th Avenue would be completed in about ten days, ^{surface treatment} and 26th Street and Saunders Road would be completed in 90 to 120 days.
