The Board of County Commissioners of Manatee County, Florida, met in REGULAR SESSION in the Court House in Bradenton, Florida, Monday, August 29th, 1960 at 9:30 a.m.

Present were Commissioners John G. Jones, Irwin Klemmer, Elmer Bustle and Tom W. Jennings, Deputy Clerk Bruce M. Cox and County Attorney George H. Harrison. Commissioner Slaughter was not present.

Minutes of the previous meetings were read. There being no alterations, corrections or additions, the Vice Chairman stated the Minutes would stand approved as read.

Public hearing was held on the petition of Catholic Burse Endowment Fund, Inc. for the vacation of the Plat of MIDWAY ESTATES (continued from August 22nd, 1960). Mr. Klemmer explained that it had been determined that the vacation of the plat would not interfere with the county highway system or the contemplated connecting road between U. S. 301 and U. S. 41 and moved that the petition be granted and resolution adopted.

John Manson, attorney for the petitioner, outlined the church properties on a map and explained that the vacation of the plat was necessary for the platting of the cemetery and it would not be desirable to have a public road through the center thereof.

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## 9TH STREET EAST STREET &amp; DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS UNDERWAY

Mrs. Lillian Orhowski, appearing for Mrs. Helen Orlaski, complained about the drainage conditions on 9th Street East at 13th Avenue East - across from the Experimental Farm (District No. 4) and requested that some action be taken to open and deepen

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the road ditches and canal so that the area would not continue to be flooded.

Mr. Bustle, Commissioner of District No. 4, the location of this problem, stated that the drainage system was to be re-worked in order to coincide with the improvement of 13th ~~Street~~<sup>Avenue</sup> East, and the Engineer's Department was proceeding on this project as rapidly as possible, and it was hoped it would be started in the near future.

John Benson, County Engineer, stated he would investigate to determine if some relief could be given right away if the situation was as bad as stated by Mrs. Orhowski.
