The Board of County Commissioners of Manatee County, Florida, met in REGULAR SESSION in the court house in Bradenton, Florida, Monday, June 26, 1961 at 9:30 a.m.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Crist.

County Attorney James R. Adams

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved on motion by Mr. Bustle, seconded by Mr. Klemmer and carried.

BAYLESS, C. M. PETITION FOR RE-ZONING TO C2 REFERRED TO P & Z COMMISSION

Mr. C. M. Bayless came before the Board relative to denial of his petition for re-zoning from Cl to C2, on U.S. 301 north of Palmetto, by the Planning and Zoning Commission. He explained that he wished to construct an enclosed building to be used as repair garage, located back of a filling station and 150 ft. from the highway; that there were no objections to the garage by the adjoining property owners.

This matter was discussed at length and the county attorney advised that due to the fact that the Enabling Act is so worded that no recommendations are made to the governing body except when motion is passed by a 4/5 majority of the Planning and Zoning Commission, (Section 8.13, Special Acts 1959); that the motion to grant this petition had failed by a 5-4 vote, therefore, no recommendation being made by the Commission no action to be taken by this Board thereon. He stated that, in his opinion, the only thing this body could do would be to recommend to the Planning and Zoning Commission that a new study be made.

Mr. Slaughter moved that this matter be referred to the Planning and Zoning Commission for study and appropriate action and that this Board be advised of its findings and action. Motion was seconded by Mr. Bibey and carried by four-fifths vote as required by Section 8.20.

CONE, W. L. BORROW PITS ON U.S. 301 TO BE DEEPENED, CLEANED

Mr. W. L. (Lewis) Cone came before the Board relative to an agreement of November 5, 1956, whereby the Board of County Commissioners had agreed to deepen borrow pits on his property after the State Road Department had used all the fill needed for State Road 43 (U.S. 301). Mr. Bibey advised that he had investigated this matter when it was called to his attention by Mr. Cone, found the agreement to be a matter of record in the minutes and that the work had not been done, and he had requested the county engineer to make a study and submit an estimate and recommendations thereon.

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Mr. Cone was assured that every effort would be made to fulfill the obligations of the previous administration in connection with the borrow pits.

#### Mr. Cone also requested

- 1) Status of improvements on road from Red Top Grocery into Parrish (State Road Department had been requested to re-build from 683 east to Parrish as secondary road fund project, but not included in budget)
- 2) That a portion of the Buckeye road be re-opemed and improved in order to provide access to area that was going to be used for farm purposes, (To be investigated by respective commissioners of Districts 1 and 2)
- 3) Improvements to Moccasin Wallow road in area of Gilley Creek (to be investigated by Mr. Bibey)

PROGRESS REPORT OF REVALUATION PROJECT

Chairman Crist read a letter from Hunnicutt & Associates, Inc., giving Progress Report of the Manatee County Revaluation Project, in which the Project Director advised that

=August 21 to September 1, 1961 scheduled as tentative date for book opening;

- -Work in Business Personal Property Department completed except for a few call-backs;
- =85% completed in Engineering Department, which involves all residential & commercial building appraisals;
- =90% (approx.) complete in urban land appraisal;
- =Approx. 80% complete in rural land appraisal; =Process Department approx. two weeks behind the field work (This dept. does all calculating of
- field work. (This dept. does all calculating of building areas, land values, extending of values and factoring values to the 80% assessment level).

# APPROPRIATION FOR PARCELLING WORK MAPS

Mr. Slaughter stated that he had discussed the matter of speeding up the revaluation program with Mr. Roberts, of Hunnicutt & Associates, and Mr. Howze; that the personnel doing the map work were willing to put in additional over-time hours in order to parcel the maps and step up completion of the program. Mr. Howze estimated that approximately \$500.00 would cover the salaries involved in this work.

Mr. Slaughter moved that the sum of \$500.00 be allocated for this purpose. Motion was seconded by Mr. Bustle and carried.

#### COMPLAINT RE TROPICAL RANCH

Mr. Clifford Bluhm complained that he was unable to rent his apartments located next to the "Tropical Ranch" on U. S. 41 (south of Bradenton) because of the noise and disturbance; that he had registered complaints with the Sheriff's office and the State Beverage

Department, but nothing had been done to relieve the situation.

Mr. Bluhm was advised that although he had a just complaint, the courts was the place for public nuisance complaints as this Board has no legal interest in such problems.

DIRECTIONAL SIGNS TO MANATEE COUNTY BEACHES BOARD TO ERECT & MAINTAIN THOSE IN COUNTY

Mr. Tom Wallace, representing the Greater Bradenton Chamber of Commerce, the Anna Maria Island and Long Boat Key Chambers, explained that in a joint action to clarify the road markings to the public beaches of the county it was proposed to erect approximately fifty (50) aluminum signs, green and white with scotch-light-treatment, on the highways. Approximately 30 of these signs will be in the city and the city officials have agreed to erect and maintain those within the municipality and the county commissioners are requested to erect and maintain approximately 20-22 in the county.

Upon motion by Mr. Slaughter, seconded by Mr. Bustle, the Board agreed to erect and maintain the signs as requested if it would not conflict with the sign project of the county engineering department. Mr. Benson said it would be possible to take care of these signs when the locations were established.
