TANGELO PARK SUBDIVISION
DEVELOPER'S PROPOSAL RE STREET IMPROVEMENTS TABLED

B. H. Sirmons, developer of Tangelo Park Subdivision, whose proposal to reimburse the county or pay cash for street improvements in lieu of bond (existing bond to be released for other purposes) had been tabled from previous meeting, was present to discuss the matter. He was advised that members of the Board had inspected the site and agreed that something would have to be done about the drainage and balance of the street paving. Mr. Sirmons stated that he was willing to pave the balance of 955 yards yet to be done and perform in accordance with his bond or pay for this work to be done by the county, but did not feel he was responsible for the ditches that were in existence prior to approval of the plat; of the subdivision in 1957; that his bond did not cover obligation for the drainage problem described by the County Engineer.

John Benson, County Engineer, stated that he had been unsuccessful in his endeavors to arrange meetings with the property owners in connection with obtaining right-of-way to provide another entrance into the subdivision (Dancey Avenue). (Only one=half r/w for this

MANATEE VETERANS MEMORIAL HOSPITAL RE: CHANGE ORDERS

PROGRESS REPORT

James Kelsall, project engineer for Watson & Company, Manatee Veterans Memorial Hospital, gave a report on change orders pending, the first being a credit of \$750.00 (approximately) on Fifth Floor extension, He reported that at the present time it was indicated that labor and materials on authorized change orders for remodeling would not reach the approved figure of \$6450.00; that because of the nature of the job it had been necessary to move farther into the building on the Second and Third floors and actual work had progressed into areas extended beyond the points previously requested, and asked if the remodeling should be continued until the \$6450.00 was depleted or if breakoff should be made on the described areas of record and request made for additional change orders as required in the areas exposed.

The Board advised that planned remodeling should be completed on change orders approved and any additional work authorized on separate change orders.
