The Board of County Commissioners of Manatee County, Florida, met in SPECIAL SESSION in the Court House in Bradenton, Florida, Thursday, March 14, 1963 at 1:30 P. M.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Bibey.

Z O N I N G

TU-40 CORAL SHORES APPROVED
Application for permit to construct building sales office on Lot 102, Coral Shores Subdivision, and request a two-year temporary permit.

Upon motion by Mr. Clark, seconded by Mr. Klemmer, two-year temporary use permit was authorized for office building in Coral Shores Subdivision.

LEGISLATION

Chairman Bibey stated that the purpose of the meeting was to determine the position of the Board regarding eighteen local bills and one general law, whether the Board would recommend or simply submit these particular bills to the legislative committee; that inasmuch as everyone had had an opportunity to read them it would not be necessary to read them here, but that the County Attorney would summarize them.

<u>NO. 3 BUILDING TRADES</u>	Approved unanimously to be submitted to Legislative Committee.
<u>NO. 4 FISHING LAW</u>	Approved 4-1 to be submitted to Legislative Committee.
<u>NO. 5---WEED CUTTING</u>	Approved unanimously to be submitted to Legislative Committee (with provision for referendum)
<u>NO. 6 WATER FRANCHISE</u>	Approved unanimously to be submitted to Legislative Committee.

- NO. 7 GROUP INSURANCE Approved unanimously to be submitted to Legislative Committee.

Mr. McClure moved that the proposed legislation for creation of the "City of Manatee" be referred to the legislative committee for consideration without any recommendation, either for or against it, by this Board. Motion was seconded by Mr. Clark. (Statement by Mr. McClure preceding motion: "At this time I would like to acknowledge the obvious time and effort the members of the Governmental study group have put upon this proposed legislation. I believe these people have shown the finest of civic motives. In view of the tremendous amount of interest and discussion concerning this proposal, I believe a public expression by a vote would serve a worthwhile purpose; however, I do not believe the creation of a municipality is within the scope of the duties or powers of a County Commission.")

Voting "Aye" on the motion were Commissioners Clark, McClure and Klemmer. Commissioner Crist and Chairman Bibey voted "No".
Motion carried.

Motion was made by Mr. Crist that the Board sponsor this bill insofar as the legislative group is concerned. Mr. Bibey vacated the Chair to the Vice Chairman. Motion was seconded by Mr. Bibey. Voting "Aye" were Commissioner Crist and Chairman Bibey. Voting "No" were Commissioners Clark, McClure and Klemmer. Motion did not carry.

NO. 19 FISH DROPS (General Law)

Approved unanimously to be submitted to Legislative Committee.

NO. 20 COUNTY CODE

Submitted to the Legislative Committee without recommendation.


