34TH STREET
PETITION FOR RELIEF OF DUST SITUATION

Mrs. A. E. Young, 4616 34th Street W., presented petition seeking relief from the dust caused by through traffic on 34th Street W. She was advised this matter would be referred to the County Engineer for recommendations as to what can be done in this situation.

12TH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT (FOR CIRCUIT JUDGE)
BOARD TO PARTICIPATE IN COST OF SPECIAL CENSUS

George Harrison, president of the Manatee County Bar Association, requested that the Board give favorable consideration toward participating in the cost of a special census for the purpose of determining whether or not the 12th Judicial Circuit would be entitled to another circuit judge. He said this is the largest circuit, geographically, in the state (includes every county between Tampa and Miami and the Gulf and Lake Okeechobee), and there are now five judges for the eight counties comprising the 12th Judicial Circuit. He noted that several years ago, when it became apparent that this circuit was entitled to another judge, Manatee County was chosen as the county where the census would be taken and Sarasota and Lee Counties helped to pay the expenses. Now Sarasota County had agreed to take the census, at an estimated cost of \$3,000.00, and Manatee and Lee Counties were being requested to share up to one-third each of the cost.

Motion was made by Mr. McClure that the Board authorize an expenditure of one-third of the cost of the special census, or \$1000.00, whichever is the lesser figure. Motion was seconded by Mr. Clark and carried.

INTERSTATE HIGHWAY NO. 75
BOARD ENDORSES RE-ALIGNMENT

RECOMMENDATIONS: TAMPA BAY
REGIONAL PLANNING COUNCIL

Don King, Executive Secretary of the Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council, spoke on a matter he said would be presented to all

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governmental bodies within the Region: the proposed extension of the Interstate Highway System. He requested that the Board adopt a resolution approving the route alignment recommended by the Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council as shown on the map of the Region, (Pinellas, Hillsborough, Manatee and Sarasota Counties) on Interstate Road No. 4, Interstate Road No. 75, Current Urban Areas 1963-projected to 1980.

Upon motion by Mr. Clark, seconded by Mr. Crist, Resolution was prepared and adopted approving the alignment recommended by the Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council on Interstate Highway No. 75.

JOHNSON, MARY (PETITION FOR PALMISTRY LICENSE)
REQUEST OF ATTORNEY TO RE-OPEN CASE DENIED

Jerome Pratt, attorney representing Mary Johnson in her application for a license to practice palmistry in Manatee County, stated his client had complied with statutory requirements as to her residency in both county and state, testimonials as to her good moral character; and unless the sheriff's report contained factual proof of bad moral character he could not understand the reason for the Board denying the license, and requested that the case be re-opened.

Chairman Bibey advised that the Board had taken official action on the application, that a license had been denied on the basis of the sheriff's report and there was no reason to re-open the case (would require four-fifths vote of the Board to do so.)

PALMA SOLA & CORAL HEIGHTS AREA
REPORT ON GROUND-WATER RESOURCES (FLORIDA GEOLOGICAL SURVEY)

The County Attorney submitted and read the report on investigation on ground-water resources of the Coral-Heights-Palma Sola area, which was carried out by personnel of the Florida Geological Survey and U.S. Geological Survey from Sunday evening, October 20, 1963, through Friday evening, October 25, 1963 for the purpose of determining the cause of the low water levels experienced in wells in this area.

In this report, R. O. Vernon, Director, made recommendations for relief from the low water levels in wells of the area, on both immediate and long-range programs. It was noted that "The total draft in the Coral Heights - Palma Sola area is so large that if all irrigation wells were stopped now, and all of the shallow wells were pumped to provide all of the needs of these communities, the water level in wells would still be so low that jet-pumps would be required and there would be a great danger of salt water contamination."

Commissioner McClure, who had accompanied the County Attorney to Tallahassee the preceding Friday to confer with the Division of Geology on this matter, explained the hydrographs and chart reflecting water level measurements made in both deep and shallow wells in the area.

PALMA SOLA - CORAL HEIGHTS AREA: WATER PROBLEM
COUNTY TO ABANDON SUIT


