The Board of County Commissioners of Manatee County, Florida, met in SPECIAL SESSION in the Court House in Bradenton, Florida, Tuesday, November 19th, 1963 at 1:30 P.M.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Bibey, who opened PUBLIC HEARING for the purpose of considering amendment to the Gulf Coast Electrical Code.

There were no objections to the amendment and the Chairman declared the Public Hearing closed.

An electrical contractor who objected to the \$50.00 fee for Certificate of Competency was advised that the hearing on this subject was held on a previous date and the amendment considered today was only the fee for Certificate of Competency for contractors on inactive status.

ELECTRICAL CODE

Motion was made by Mr. Klemmer that the Board adopt a resolution approving and adopting the Manatee County Electrical Code (also known as the Gulf Coast Electrical Code), approved in regular session on the 19th day of August, 1963, together with all amendments*thereto. Motion was seconded by Mr. McClure and carried unanimously.

(*Amendment: A Certificate of Competency may be held on an inactive basis for a period of three (3) years for \$5.00 per year. On or before the end of the third year the Certificate must be activated or dropped. Except in case of extreme hardship an inactive Certificate may be activated only during the first 15 days of October and the first 15 days of April. Hardship cases must be approved by the Licensing Board and by the Board of County Commissioners.)

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Bibey, who opened PUBLIC HEARING for the purpose of considering Amendments and Changes to the Southern Standard Building Code, Part III, Plumbing, 1962-1963 Edition.

During the Public Hearing, addition of a new item (1211) concerning installation of wells was discussed at length (considered necessary because of recent water shortage problem in the Palma Soal area). Some modification to amendment regarding Certificate and number and firm name to be painted on each side of all service trucks, in letters not less than 3" high, was also discussed.
