Recommendations of the Planning Commission were presented by Neno Spagna, Planning Director.

The Chairman stated that if there were no objections SE-402 would be deferred for one week. There were no objections.

The County Engineer read a letter (dated July 8, 1970) from the U.S. Department of the Interior, Fish and Wildlife Service, reiterating their recommendation that permit request not be issued on application for Department of the Army permit 70-214 (SAJSP) by Manatee County. This application concerning dredging in Frog Creek and McMullen Creek, Terra Ceia Bay.

PROJECT NO. 576

Robert Moon, Right-of-Way Agent, reported that the joint Manatee County-City of Bradenton

met the requirements as a participation project (75 percent signatures property owners).

STATE ROAD 675 (GILLEY CREEK)

Mr. Moon submitted request of the Department of Transportation in connection with test borings for a proposed new bridge crossing Gilley Creek on State Road 675 (Job No. 13510-1602 S-675).

Motion was made by Mr. Burton that the State Department of Transportation be allowed to proceed with the test borings as outlined. Motion was seconded by Mr. Hutches and carried unanimously.

WHITFIELD AVENUE - WILLOW STREET  
RE: CLOSING BYPASS

L. J. Horan and Frank Sims submitted proposal to eliminate a traffic

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hazard by closing a by-pass road connecting Willow Street and Whitfield Avenue.

The Whitfield Estates-Ballentine Manor Estates Association, by letter dated July 14, 1970, advised they would undertake, at no cost to the County, elimination of the hazard by erection of low planted barriers so that the intersection of Whitfield Avenue and Willow Street would become the only intersection at this point and they would clear the existing island to provide unrestricted vision in both directions. The Sara Bay Country Club had adopted a resolution agreeing to remove the trees and shrubbery from the two islands fronting the Club and assume permanent maintenance of the islands conditioned on the use by the Club for parking or other club activities.

This matter was referred to the County Attorney for his recommendation as to necessary public hearings, etc., for closing the by-pass, and for review by Commissioner Dierks with other parties concerned. (Recommendation at next regular meeting if possible.)

PARKS & RECREATION

RE: FLA-B12 BEAUTIFICATION PROGRAM

John Marble, director, Parks and Recreation, outlined the recommended changes to be made in the five-year Fla.-B 12 beautification program as follows:

- =Installation of water to Palma Sola Park
- =Construction of tennis court in Palmetto
- =Landscape grounds, new Palmetto Library
- =Landscape grounds, Motor Vehicle Inspection Station
- =Sidewalks and picnic tables at Bayfront Park
- =Shell Warner's Bayou parking area
- =Construction of Crane Park restrooms
- =Extend time to December 31, 1970

Motion was made by Mr. Hutches that the Chairman of the Board be authorized to sign a letter to the appropriate Housing and Urban Development officials requesting the changes in the program as outlined by Mr. Marble. Motion was seconded by Mr. Dierks and unanimously carried.

HOUSING & URBAN DEVELOPMENT - BEAUTIFICATION PROGRAM

He said because of proximity to Sarasota, postal services from the Sarasota post office were initiated many years ago and adopted by the Florida Power & Light Company and the telephone company; that it is a federal matter and unless an overwhelming majority of the people in the area request it, nothing will be done toward initiating a change from Sarasota to Manatee.

AMBULANCE SERVICE

SUPPLEMENT TO LAWRENCE AMBULANCE SERVICE

Chairman Fortson reported that a review had been made of the operating expenses of Lawrence Ambulance Service and after conference with the accountant concerning their financial difficulties, the possibility of an additional supplement had been discussed. In order to maintain adequate ambulance service in Manatee County it appeared it would be necessary to supplement the amount of \$4500.00 to cover operating expenses for the period June 1 to July 15, 1970.
