

NOVEMBER 24, 1970

The Board of County Commissioners of Manatee County, Florida, met in REGULAR SESSION in the Court House in Bradenton, Florida, Tuesday, November 24, 1970 at 9:00 A. M.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Fortson.

MANATEE MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

J. C. Garrison, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, and Bently Lang, Administrator, of the Manatee Memorial Hospital, came before the Board to submit recommendation on the selection of a firm to provide architectural and master planning studies for additional beds in Manatee County.

Master plan studies done for other hospitals were received from
E. Todd Wheeler, Washington, D.C.
Smith Kovach & Associates, Miami, Florida
Ellerbe - Architects, St. Paul, Minnesota
Donald Ritchie, Architect, Fort Lauderdale, Florida
for study by the architectural committee, and the latter two firms were selected to submit proposals.

The Board of Trustees recommended that DONALD RITCHIE, AIA, be authorized to come in and conduct the survey for a fee of \$12,500.00. The recommendation of the Trustees and the proposal of the architectural firm were taken under advisement by the Board members.

LIBRARY SERVICE - APPLICATION FOR PROGRAM GRANT

George Vangsness, Chairman of the Library Board, and Mrs. Catherine Ramsey, County Librarian, submitted Application and Agreement for Supplemental Program Grant, State Plan for the Further Extension of Library Service, to Florida Department of State, Division of State Library Services. Motion was made by Mr. Dierks that the appropriate county officers be authorized to execute the Application and Agreement as presented. Motion was seconded by Mr. Burton and carried unanimously. (Full amount to county, if approved, \$10,900.)

Discussion: Restructure organization; appointment of Library Board by the county; legislation; supplemental appropriation to meet budget deficit of the County Library.

HEATHER HILLS ESTATES, INC. (UNIT 1) PLATTED "UTILITY AREA" VACATED

Public Hearing was declared open for the purpose of considering petition of Heather Hills Estates, Inc., for the vacation of a portion of the plat of Heather Hills Estates, Unit 1. John C. Manson, attorney for the petitioner, explained that the sewer plant was placed on a parcel adjacent to the parcel marked "Utility Area" on the plat, and the developers now wished to use this area for another purpose.

There were no objections, and the Public Hearing was declared closed.

Mr. Dierks moved for the adoption of a Resolution vacating that

portion of Heather Hills Estates, Unit 1, as described in the petition. Motion was seconded by Mr. Hutches and unanimously carried.

Z O N I N G

Recommendations of the Planning Commission were presented by Neno Spagna, Planning Director.

SE-425 MABEL G. BRIDGES M/HOME PERMIT APPROVED

Request for mobilehome for caretaker in conjunction with agriculture on property located at 1827 Leffingwell Ave., Ellenton, Florida.

The Planning Commission recommended approval for a period of two years after which the Zoning Director may renew it for successive two year periods provided the character of the area remains essentially the same.

Motion was made by Mr. Burton that SE-425 for Mabel G. Bridges be approved for a two-year period with renewal based on recommendation of the Planning Commission. Motion was seconded by Mr. Hutches and carried.

DECOR PRODUCTS, INC. MINIATURE GOLF COURSE APPROVED

(By Frank W. Schmudde) - Request for Special Exception to permit a Miniature Golf Course in a C-1 District on property located at 1508 Cortez Road, Bradenton.

Committee report was read. The Planning Commission recommended approval for a period of six months subject to successive six month approvals by the Zoning Director provided the operation does not turn out to be a traffic hazard, and subject to approval by Department of Transportation of any direct ingress and egress to Cortez Road.

Motion was made by Mr. McClure that SE-426 for Decor Products, Inc., be approved as recommended by the Planning Commission. Motion was seconded by Mr. Hutches and carried. (And as outlined in stipulations in Committee Report.)

SE-427 SVEN & EDITH MAY BENGTTSSON M/HOME DENIED

Request for mobilehome in conjunction with the operation of a grove on property located at 4529 51st St. E., Bradenton.

The Planning Commission recommended approval for a one year period, at the end of which time the mobilehome shall be removed.

Mrs. Florence Mrazek, whose property adjoins the Bengtsson property, objected to the trailers being located next to her home.

Motion was made by Mr. Dierks that SE-427 for Sven & Edith May Bengtsson be denied. Motion was seconded by Mr. Burton and carried unanimously.

SE-429 TULLY A. CLARK M/HOME PERMIT APPROVED

Request for mobilehome for occupancy by caretaker-laborer in conjunction with agriculture on 10-acre parcel located at 2306 24th Ave. E., Palmetto.

The Planning Commission recommended approval for a period of two years, after which the Zoning Director may renew it for successive two year periods providing the character of the area remains substantially the same.

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Motion was made by Mr. Burton that SE=429 be approved for a period of two years with renewal as recommended by the Planning Commission. Motion was seconded by Mr. Hutches and carried unanimously.

R-428 DOUGLAS K. & MARJORIE A. HALL DISTRICT C-1 DEFERRED
Request for change of zoning from District R-1AA to District C-1 to permit the operation of a Beauty Shop (home) on property located at 608 - 60th Ave. We., Bradenton, Fla.
The Planning Commission recommended denial for reasons outlined in the Committee report (report read).

Douglas Hall explained that the shop would be installed in the west side of a two-car garage; that there were no objections at the Planning Commission, and petition signed by twenty-one residents-neighbors was evidence that the people in the subdivision were in favor of the request being approved.

Upon recommendation by Mr. Dierks that action on this item be deferred, the Chairman stated that if there were no objections this would be postponed until the next regular meeting. There were no objections.

N-80 LAZY ACRES TRAILER PARK EXPANSION APPROVED
(Isabel E. Lundgren) - Request for the expansion of non-conforming use in an R-1A District by permitting the use of a mobilehome as both office and residence on property located at 515 - 77th St. E., Palmetto, Fla.
Committee report read.
The Planning Commission recommended approval.

Motion was made by Mr. McClure that N-80 for expansion of Lazy Acres Trailer Park be approved. Motion was seconded by Mr. Hutches and carried unanimously.

S114(F) LAZY "B" RANCHES FINAL PLAT APPROVED
The Planning Commission recommended approval of the final plat, subject to compliance with all departmental requirements. Mr. Spagna noted that the plat had been reviewed and approved by the appropriate county departments.

The County Engineer advised that the rural-type roads comply with minimum subdivision requirements (rural streets wherein lots exceed five acres), and although dedicated to the public the streets will not be accepted for maintenance by the County unless and until they meet paved street specifications. (See letter dated October 16, 1970)

Motion was made by Mr. Dierks that the final plat of Lazy "B" Ranches be approved for recording purposes and that the letter from the County Engineer be made a matter of record. Motion was seconded by Mr. Hutches and carried unanimously.

R. D. Newall came before the Board concerning what appears to have been an error in early planning when property on 65th Street NW was zoned for two-family homes, stating that the property owners favored rezoning from R-1AA to R-1AB (letters sent, but affidavits required). Motion was made by Mr. Dierks that the Board of County Commissioners initiate petition to rezone the property in question from R-1AA to R-1AB for appropriate public hearing by the Planning Commission. Motion was seconded by Mr. McClure and unanimously carried.

POMELLO PARK (POPE PROPERTY)

It was brought to the attention of the Board that Roy Pope, who had

purchased property in Pomello Park was being denied access by Mr. Woeller; that Mr. Woeller, in 1969, had petitioned the Board to recognize the platted streets as public, even though the dedication had been revoked, in order that he could get electric service and REA could install power poles.

The County Attorney advised that a letter had been written to REA as to status for the purpose of installing power lines, but Mr. Pope's interests should be developed by private counsel.

AIR & WATER POLLUTION CONTROL REGION REQUEST PLACEMENT MANATEE COUNTY

Randolph Snell advised that the Manatee County Water & Air Pollution Control Board consented to resolution urging placement of Manatee County in the Southwestern Florida Intrastate Air Quality Control Region. The proposed resolution was read by the County Attorney.

Mr. Hutches moved for the adoption of the Resolution requesting the Florida Department of Air and Water Pollution Control to give further consideration to its recommendation to the United States regarding placing Manatee County in the proposed West Central Florida Intrastate Air Quality Control Region; that Manatee County be removed from said proposed region and placed in the proposed Southwestern Florida Intrastate Air Quality Control Region. Motion was seconded by Mr. Dierks. After discussion, motion carried unanimously.

CENTRAL SEWER PROGRAM

Mr. Hutches reported on a meeting with HUD and state officials in Atlanta concerning the Manatee County Central Sewer Project and possible funding.

GATEWAY EAST

Motion was made by Mr. Dierks that the County Attorney be authorized to file necessary legal action against the developers of Gateway East because of the problem of infiltration of sewer lines into county streets. Motion was seconded by Mr. Hutches and carried.

Motion was made by Mr. Dierks that county departments under jurisdiction of the Board be authorized to observe Friday after Thanksgiving as a holiday. Motion was seconded by Mr. Hutches and carried.
