The Board of County Commissioners of Manatee County, Florida, met in REGULAR SESSION in the Court House in Bradenton, Florida, Tuesday, January 8, 1974 at 9:05 A. M.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Burton.

ORDINANCE 74-1: SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS

Public hearing was opened for the purpose of considering

ORDINANCE NO. 74-1

AN ORDINANCE OF MANATEE COUNTY, FLORIDA PROVIDING THAT SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS ARE APPLICABLE TO ALL LANDS WITHIN THE UNINCORPORATED AREA OF MANATEE COUNTY, FLORIDA, PROVIDING THAT BUILDING PERMITS ARE NOT TO BE ISSUED UNLESS PROPERTY IS ADEQUATELY SERVED BY PUBLIC OR PRIVATE STREET WHICH HAS BEEN CONSTRUCTED AND A DRAINAGE PLAN FOR THE PROPERTY HAS BEEN APPROVED; PROVIDING THAT SUBDIVISION LOTS SHALL NOT BE DIVIDED INTO SMALLER LOTS WITHOUT APPROVAL OF REPLAT; AMENDING PROVISIONS OF LAWS OF FLORIDA, SPECIAL ACTS, CHAPTER 63-1599, THE MANATEE COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE AND SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS TO EXTENT OF ANY CONFLICT, PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Art Fischer, Planning Director, gave background and problems researched-purpose of this ordinance to correct discrepancies.

The proposed ordinance was read by the County Attorney.

Carl King, president of the Manatee County Board of Realtors, expressed concern about gradual erosion of property rights; referred to tracts purchased by people (old plats such as Waterbury) with the idea of building a home in the country, some people do not want to live on a road or street, paved or improved for public use. He concurred with requirement for drainage plans, with suggestion such plans be approved by the County Engineer, but not necessarily prepared by professional engineer. He made additional comments and suggestions.

Dick Jordan referred to hardship in certain areas and problem of personal interpretations on sections of the ordinance.

Following lengthy discussion, in view of the comments and suggestions it was recommended that a work session be scheduled for Monday, January 14, 1974 at 7:30 P.M. for further discussion with interested persons.

The Chairman stated that if there were no objections Public Hearing would be continued until Tuesday, January 15, 1974 (next regular meeting). There were no objections.

ZONING

R-615 CURTIS N. COX and H. H. HOWELL P.U.D. DENIED
(Sidney R. Wilkinson, agent) - requesting change of zoning from Districts R-1B and R-1C to District P.U.D. for the purpose of a Planned Unit Development on property located at 11116 Manatee Avenue West, Perico Island, Bradenton. This item had been postponed from previous meetings pending report from the State as to endangered lands, etc. (Department of Natural Resources)

The Planning Commission recommended denial. The Committee Report was read by the Planning Director.

Sidney Wilkinson gave a review of the concept= purpose to develop same facilities for younger working people and families as have been developed for retirees and senior citizens; Department of Natural Resources surveyed area and advised this is not environmentally endangered land; mangrove/low area will not be disturbed; traffic problem recognized and developers will cooperate in efforts to resolve, etc.

In rebuttal to arguments against the project, Mr. Wilkinson further clarified plans to develop into facilities for young families with more than adequate recreational and "green" "open Space" areas, and no greater increase in traffic than would be created if developed under present zoning.

Mr. Fortson pointed out traffic problem on Manatee Avenue and no plans for any changes - traffic count already exceeds that allowed for two-lane road; concerned about increased traffic problem and increased density in this area; no plans for extending county sewer lines; not in public interest of the county to increase to higher density. He recommended and moved that R-615 to rezone to P.U.D. be DENIED. Motion was seconded by Mr. Hutches and carried unanimously.

RECESS

After a short recess, the Board reconvened with all members present.

ARBOR TERRACE, SECTION 2 ZONING

T-1-59(F) ARBOR TERRACE - Sec. 2 DEFERRED

The Planning Commission recommended approval of final plans North side of 57th Avenue W., east of Third Street W., Bradenton (204 Travel Trailer sites on 12.4 acres) (Bob Quinn, developer) ==\$9,900 bond required for completion of improvements.

Mr. Dierks recommended that action be deferred on Arbor Terrace, Section 2, until the appropriate bond is posted and approved. There were no objections.

MINING ORDINANCE - CONSULTANT

Art Fischer, Planning Director, and Gordon Bartle, member, Planning Commission, came before the Board to recommend that county seek outside expert(s) to determine if state guidelines should be used or modified and question if state requirements adequate in watershed areas, and assist in re-writing of Mining Ordinance where needed. The name of Dr. Lamb, expert soil mechanic, was offered as possible consultant at estimated fee of \$7500.00.

There was discussion of possibility to obtain services of qualified consultant capable of being expert witness in connection with Mining Ordinance and proposed project of Belcher Oil Company.

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Motion was made by Mr. Fortson that Mr. Fischer and Mr. Bartle negotiate for services of consultant-expert witness, etc., and make recommendation back to the Board. Motion was seconded by Mr. Hutches and carried unanimously.

TRAVEL

Motion was made by Mr. Hutches that county personnel (five members various departments) be authorized to go to Tampa in connection with the Mining Ordinance. Motion was seconded by Mr. McClure and carried.

WATER POLLUTION CONTROL PROJECT, PARTS C & D
RE: SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS

Public hearing on two items on Special Assessment Roll, Water Pollution Control Project, Parts C & D, continued from December 18, 1973, was further continued until January 15, 1974. (Parcel No. 22, Bob Lowrey property; property of Jess Barton)

DESOTO LAKES COUNTRY CLUB COLONY, UNITS 1 & 2, SECTION A
STREETS ACCEPTED FOR MAINTENANCE

The County Engineer advised that he had inspected certain streets in DeSoto Lakes Country Club Colony, Units 1 & 2, Section A, and certified that all work has been completed satisfactorily, and recommended that said streets be accepted for county maintenance.

Motion was made by Mr. Dierks to approve recommendation by the County Engineer and that

Canterbury Drive, Canterbury Way, Canterbury Circle, and Inverness Drive south and west from its intersection with Canterbury Drive through Lot 25 on the north side and through Lot 56 on the south side, DeSoto Lakes Country Club Colony, Units 1 & 2, Section A,

be accepted for County maintenance. Motion was seconded by Mr. Hutches and carried unanimously.

PORT MANATEE STORAGE TANK

Motion was made by Mr. Hutches that the appropriate county officers be authorized to execute contract with The Crom Company for construction of water storage facilities at Port Manatee (Bid \$61,725.00 accepted 11/27/73). Motion was seconded by Mr. Fortson and carried unanimously.

AMBULANCE SERVICE: FLORIDA DIVISION OF HEALTH

Ken McKendree advised that the State of Florida is requiring a fee, prior to granting a license to operate, for each Ambulance Company, each ambulance and each technician or driver as follows:

He recommended that County pay the licensing fee for all personnel with provision for repayment to county if employment terminated within specified time.

Motion was made by Mr. McClure that the County pay the licensing fees to Florida Division of Health for all personnel, with requirement that each employee sign a payroll deduction slip authorizing the county to deduct the \$15.00 fee from his pay should he leave county employment, either by choice or termination, prior to six months from date fee is paid, as recommended by Mr. McKendree. Motion was seconded by Mr. Hutches and carried unanimously.

LIBRARY BOARD

Mrs. Allan Brown, whose term as member of the Library Board was expiring January, 1974, had submitted request to be replaced.

It was brought to the attention of the Board, also, that the term of Mrs. Wick (Kay) Kirby would be expiring at the same time.

Motion was made by Mr. McClure that Mrs. Harper Kendrick be appointed as member of the Manatee County Library Board, to replace Mrs. Brown, for a term of two years, and that Mrs. Wick Kirby be reappointed for a term of two years. Motion was seconded by Mr. Dierks and carried.

BUDGET AMENDMENT: LIBRARY

Motion was made by Mr. McClure to accept a check in the amount of \$8250.00 - State grant to the Manatee County Library System - (first quarterly payment of a Service to the Aged Grant SCORE) and that the County Attorney be authorized to prepare the appropriate resolution for the necessary budget amendment. Motion was seconded by Mr. Dierks and unanimously carried.

PROJECT NO. 622

Robert Moon, right-of-way agent, reported that Project No. 622 (13th Avenue W. - from 43rd St. to 45th St.), with 100 percent participation, was ready for public hearing for objections. Motion was made by Mr. McClure that public hearing for objections on this project be held Tuesday, January 22, 1974. Motion was seconded by Mr. Fortson and carried unanimously.

PROJECT NO. 588

Mr. Moon reported that Project No. 588 (9th Ave. N.W. - from 71st St. N.W. to 67th St. N.W.), with 86.42 percent participation, was ready for the first public hearing. Motion was made by Mr. Fortson that public hearing for objections on this project be held Tuesday, January 22, 1974. Motion was seconded by Mr. McClure and carried.

ROAD PARTICIPATION PROJECTS

Mr. Dierks announced that there would be a work session with road construction contractors and the County Engineer, Monday, January 14, 1974 at 10:00 A.M. for the purpose of discussing paving costs, etc., on participation projects.

COUNTY PERSONNEL: HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Motion was made by Mr. Hutches that working hours of personnel in the Manatee County Highway Department be designated as 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., as recommended by the County Engineer. These hours would pertain to County crews. Motion was seconded by Mr. Dierks and carried.

MANASOTA BASIN BOARD

Report by the County Attorney on a meeting in Tallahassee, January 7, 1974, concerning water management district, Manasota Basin, is summarized as follows: Mr. McClure and County Attorney, representing Manatee County, Dick Nelson, attorney representing Sarasota County, Sen. Tom Gallen and Representative Ralph Haben met with Charles Sanders, acting chief of State Division of Interior for the Department of Natural Resources, and Ken Woodburn and Jay Landers, both on the Governor's staff; agreed to activate the ridge and lower Gulf Coast Water Management District - appoint members to that district board; agreed to activate the Manasota Basin and Governor's office will appoint members, with request for nominations from Manatee and Sarasota Counties. As to financing, no assurances immediately available; however, Department of Natural Resources will look into some source of funds for balance of this fiscal year (approximately \$25,000) ==possibly from emergency reserve account which the State has. Sarasota and Manatee Counties are to send joint resolution outlining request and submitting recommendations for appointees to Manasota Basin Board.

(December 29, 1964) and with the terms of Bond Resolution authorizing the issuance of \$3,485,000 Water and Sewer Revenue Bonds, Issue of 1965, Series A and Series B (July 19, 1965), the Deputy Clerk and the County Attorney proceeded to draw for redemption 40 bonds from among the 620 bonds (Numbered 1 through 620) which were delivered to Consumers Utilities Corp. and DeSoto Utilities Corp., which have not been redeemed.
