The Board of County Commissioners of Manatee County, Florida, met in REGULAR SESSION in the Court House in Bradenton, Florida, Tuesday, August 20, 1974 at 9:09 A.M.

Commissioner Ken Burton, Chairman, was not present.

The meeting was called to order by Vice Chairman Hutches.

#### ZONING

The Planning Director read proposed Resolution approving

P.U.D.-5(P) THE SHRODER COMPANY (Mangrove Point)  
Prel/ Development Plan for 150 dwelling units on 30.53  
acres at Kingston Road with stipulations on number of  
boat docks and location, limiting 2-story units and  
location, requirements in construction of necessary  
intersections and signalizations at entrance on Kingston  
Road and Cortez Road, etc.

Mr. Fortson moved for the adoption of the Resolution approving Preliminary Development Plans for Mangrove Point - P.U.D 5(P) - as read. Motion was seconded by Mr. McClure and carried unanimously.

#### METROPOLITAN PLANNING AGENCY (DOT)

In connection with designation of this county as part of an urbanized area by the Bureau of the Census and request by the Department of Transportation to designate a Metropolitan Planning Agency to receive the planning funds now made available, Mr. Fischer read a proposed letter designating the Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council as such Agency to represent Manatee County. He said Sarasota County Commission had also designated TBRPC as MPA for that county.

Motion was made by Mr. McClure that a letter to the Florida Department of Transportation, designating Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council as Metropolitan Planning Agency for Manatee County be executed, as read by Mr. Fischer. Motion was seconded by Mr. Dierks and carried.

#### EARTH MOVING PERMIT (KAWA)

Motion was made by Mr. McClure to approve application of Abraham Kawa for Earth Moving permit No. CC-7 (remove soil from one area and use for fill in another area, both locations on Sneads Island, under ownership of Cr. Carver). Motion was seconded by Mr. Fortson and carried unanimously.

#### ZONING

Mr. Fortson moved for the adoption of a Resolution requesting the Manatee County Planning Commission to recommend whether or not property in Bayshore Gardens Subdivision should be changed from present zoning of R-1AA (One and Two Family Dwellings) to R-1-AB (One Family Dwelling) Districts. Motion was seconded by Mr. McClure and carried unanimously.

#### PRIVATE EASEMENT (DAVIDSON)

Motion was made by Mr. Dierks that the County Attorney be authorized to prepare the appropriate resolution for approval of a private easement, requested by E. A. Davidson, into an industrial area (Triad Tech, Inc.). Motion was seconded by Mr. McClure and carried.

17TH <sup>Avenue</sup> STREET - PETITION TROPICANA APPROVED (SUBJECT TO EASEMENTS)

Public hearing was opened for the purpose of considering petition by TROPICANA PRODUCTS, INC. (and subsidiary, B & H Project, Inc.) to vacate a portion of 17th Avenue East.

Robert Boylston, attorney for the petitioner, advised that this vacation is necessary in order for the petitioner to construct certain warehouse and storage facilities on a portion of the property, all lying west of 15th Street East.

Carlos Ugarte, County Engineer, advised that the Highway Department has no objection to the vacation of the street in question; however, he recommended that the following be taken into consideration:

- 1) The street was recently improved and the County should be compensated for cost of such improvements;
- 2) A drainage ditch along north r/w remain intact and the owner provide a minimum of a 25-foot easement; that Highway Department is willing to review any plans for the piping or relocation of the ditch;
- 3) Utilities should be located. (Construct two inlets approximately 200 feet west of 15th Street East.)

Chris Angelidis, Director of Manatee County Utilities System, offered no objection to the property not being used as a thoroughfare but requested that a permanent easement be granted for the 18-inch and 2-inch water lines located on that portion of the right-of-way.

Petitioner's attorney said they would be willing to comply with all stipulations.

Public hearing was closed. Motion was made by Mr. Fortson that the petition be granted for the vacation of 17th Avenue East, as requested, subject to compliance with recommendations of the MCUS Director and the County Engineer. Motion was seconded by Mr. McClure and carried. (Petition recorded)

Public hearing was opened for the purpose of considering petition on lot clearing

## WHITFIELD INDUSTRIAL PARK, PHASES I, II

The County Engineer certified that the work had been completed in Whitfield Industrial Park, Phases One and Two, and recommended that the streets be accepted for maintenance and the performance bond released.

Motion was made by Mr. McClure that the streets in Whitfield Industrial Park be accepted for County Maintenance and the performance bonds released (as follows):

## 75TH STREET &amp; 53RD AVENUE WEST

Robert Moon, Right-of-way Agent, advised that Mr. Preston will give option for the property required for extension of 75th Street W. and 53rd Avenue W., with purchase price based on old appraised value, but he is concerned that he will have to pay for sewer lines along properties used for agricultural purposes.

Herb Hayes, Consulting Engineer, advised that there was nothing designed

for that area and no present plans as it was not now economically feasible; however, if the property is subdivided it would be assessed according to law.

**SEWER PROJECT, PART A, SECTION IV (CLAYTON)**

By letter dated August 20, 1974, Russell & Axon (Herbert Hayes) advised that Clayton Construction Company, contractor on Sewer Project #6681-8b, Part A, Section IV, has continued to diligently pursue correction of items outlined in notice of decision on termination of contract; however, they have not been able to meet all stipulations. It was recommended that in the event the Board postpones its decision another week and Clayton is still not in compliance that Paul Brost (in responsible charge of construction operations) be directed to appear before the Board to explain inability to comply.

Motion was made by Mr. McClure that the Board defer action for one week and follow the recommendations of the Consulting Engineers. Motion was seconded by Mr. Fortson and carried unanimously.

**SEWER PROJECT, PART C, SECTION II**

(RE: LOCATION SEWER LINE 26TH STREET WEST)

In connection with inquiries questioning the location of proposed sewer lines on the west side of 26th Street W., between 33rd Avenue W. and 36th Avenue W., Paul Williams, with Russell & Axon, advised that this location was chosen because it is the least expensive way to serve the adjacent property; that relocation farther east would result in longer service lines, repair and/or replacement of storm sewer, curb and pavement at increased cost of approximately \$20,000.

Mr. Hutches suggested that Mr. McClure contact those property owners who are not agreeable to the present location and explain the report (letter of August 20, 1974) from the Consulting Engineers. There were no objections.

**CEDAR HAMMOCK DRAIN**

Mayor A. K. Leach appeared on behalf of Village Green and requested the County to clean Cedar Hammock Drain, which goes through this area annexed into the City of Bradenton, as city residents are entitled to the same services as those in the unincorporated areas .

During discussion it was pointed out that the cities receive fifty percent (50%) of taxes collected within the incorporated areas in the Road and Bridge Fund; however, the Board indicated it would be receptive to considering an agreement concerning maintenance of canals in annexed areas.

**SHRINE NEWSPAPER DAYS - PROCLAMATION**

Robert DeVillez submitted Resolution in connection with the 52nd Anniversary of the opening of the first Shriners Hospital for Crippled Children and proclamation in tribute for their great humanitarian work.

Mr. McClure moved for the adoption of the Resolution proclaiming October 4 and 5, 1974 as "Newspaper Days" and asking that all citizens join in paying tribute to the Shrine total work. Motion was seconded by Mr. Fortson and carried unanimously.

The County Attorney submitted request from the Attorney for the Manatee County School Board to have election of non-partisan School Board members placed on the ballot. His recommendation that this be placed on the General Election Ballot on November 5, 1974, was accepted.

**AIRPORT AUTHORITY - CANDIDATE'S NAME WITHDRAWN**

Upon request by Richard T. Mannion to withdraw from the Airport Authority race of September 10, 1974 (First Primary Election) and certification that he will not accept the nomination for member of the Airport Authority, motion was made by Mr. Dierks that his request be granted and withdrawal of his name as a candidate be approved. Motion was seconded by Mr. McClure and carried unanimously.

The Supervisor of Elections advised that since the ballots for September 10, 1974 Election were already printed, which included the name of Richard T. Mannion, that portion of the ballot would be "locked out".

**MCUS FUNDS: 13.5 RESERVE ACCOUNT**

Mr. Dierks moved for the adoption of a Resolution authorizing Chemical Bank to invest \$191,233.33 in a five-month Certificate of Deposit (11-3/4% annual rate) 13.5M Reserve Account. Motion was seconded by Mr. McClure and carried unanimously.
