The meeting was called to order by Chairman Burton.

#### FARM-CITY WEEK PROCLAMATION

Henry Prine presented a Proclamation for recognition of contributions of agricultural people to the progress of Manatee County and a better understanding of inter-dependence of farm and city people on each other.

pictures of the property with recommendation that it be mowed within 200 feet of the Wood residence. He said there was also complaints about the appearance of the barn.

Allen McPherson was present and submitted pictures of the entire area and noted that if he has to clear his property this should also apply to other properties, and they should be cleaned up.

Mr. Hutches advised that this is in his District, that these are ten-acre parcels in Braden River Ranchettes and zoned Agricultural; that the property in question is pastureland and although there are some weeds in the grass, if it is kept mowed there will be little for the animals to eat.

Mr. Hutches moved for the adoption of a Resolution denying the Petition of James Wood, File No. LC-812. Motion was seconded by Mr. Fortson and carried unanimously.

ZONING

The Planning Director submitted recommendations of the Planning Commission, postponed or continued from Board meeting of October 30.

R-683 COUNTY COMMISSION INITIATED DISTRICT "A" ADOPTED  
 Request rezone from District -T- (Mobile Home Park District) to District -A- (General Agricultural District), 503 acres m/1 located approximately 1000 ft. east of 57th St. E. (Morgan Johnson Road) and 1350 ft. north of S.R. 64, bordered on the north by the Manatee River.  
 The Planning Commission had recommended approval.

John Savary, attorney representing the owner and petitioner, Walter Clark, opposed this petition to rezone the property back to Agriculture. In summary, he said site plan had been submitted and they were working with the Department of Transportation to utilize the drainage canals to alleviate some problems; that plans were not definite as to how DOT will split the property; that he feels the reasons for rezoning are legally insufficient; that the owners are interested in selling the property, but two contracts for sale did not close; that the potential purchaser should be able to seek any zonine he desires.

Mr. McClure pointed out that Mr. Clark has had five years to develop this property, and it was not feasible to develop as a mobilehome park.

Mr. Hutches recommended that R-683 be approved and moved for the adoption of a Resolution rezoning the property from District "T" (Mobile Home Park) to District "A" (Agricultural). Motion was seconded by Mr. Dierks and carried unanimously.

R-696 JAMES FREED REFERRED TO PLANNING COMMISSION  
 Request to rezone .33 acre from District R-1A to R-3 for two additional apartments on property located at 1024 - 39th Ave. E., Ellenton.

James Freed said he had lived in the converted garage for two years, but had moved out when he was notified it was illegal. He had bought the three-apartment house and then finished the interior of the garage for living quarters (plumbing and some electrical already in), but had not obtained building permit for this work.

Upon question if owner can petition for expansion of non-conforming use and, if approved, can obtain the necessary building permit(s), inspections, etc., Mr. McClure recommended that the matter be referred

to the County Attorney and the Planning Director to see if this could be worked out. There were no objections.

R-703 LEONA LeGRANDE "PR" DISTRICT POSTPONED  
Request for rezone of .258 acre from District R-1A to PR (Professional) District for a Real Estate Office located at 2316 - 29th Avenue W., Bradenton.  
The Planning Commission had recommended denial.

Mr. Fisher advised that there were objections at the Planning Commission public hearing for zoning change. Upon question, he advised that a Special Exception could not be allowed under present zoning, but study was underway regarding home businesses.

Mrs. LeGrande said she wished to combine her home and license, and it would not change any image of the property or neighborhood.

Upon recommendation, action was deferred pending review of the new proposed ordinance.

SE-732 GOSPEL CRUSADE, INC. APPROVED IN PART  
Request to grant a Special Exception to amend SE-342 on revised plans, including additional travel trailer spaces on 71.60 acres located on north side of Upper Manatee River Road, bounded on the north by Manatee River and lying approximately 228 ft. west of SE corner of Section 16.  
The Planning had recommended approval.

Mr. Hutches stated he had no objections to items outlined in the recommendations by the Planning Commission with the exception of expansion of the camping-trailer facilities. He relayed objections from Mrs. Moore, who represents five other families, to the expansion of travel trailer facilities.

Rev. D. Dirstine, president of Gospel Crusade and director of grounds, said the twenty-five additional sites was not a part of the mobilehome complex, but for January-February-March conference sessions; that he was not aware of trespassers, etc., from Christian Retreat and pointed out that others have access to the river from other areas; that Gospel Crusade was attempting to comply with all requirements.
