The Board of County Commissioners, Manatee County, Florida met in REGULAR SESSION in the Courthouse, Bradenton, Florida, Tuesday, August 22, 1978 at 9:08 a.m.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman.

Invocation by Rev. Kent Smith, Palma Sola Prebyterian Church.

PARTICIPATION PROJECT NO. 1034

The Chairman opened the public hearing, continued July 20, 1978, for hearing objections on

PARTICIPATION PROJECT 1034 - 18th Street W.
between 48th and 49th Ave. W.

Bob Moon, Right of Way Agent, reported that the three property owners who did not have pipe already installed along their property at time of the hearing on July 20th, have paid for the pipe (in cash to the Highway/Engineering Department) thereby enabling the county engineer to reduce the cost per front foot to \$6.10.

There being no one else present to speak on the project, the Chairman declared the public hearing closed.

Motion was made by Mr Fortson to approve the project and adopt a Resolution Ordering the Special Improvements on Project No. 1034, and authorizing preparation of a Preliminary Special Assessment Roll for public hearing on September 5, 1978 at 9:00 a.m. Motion was seconded by Mr McClure and carried unanimously.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT

Public hearing was declared open for purpose of considering the 1978-79 Community Development Block Grant application, as administered by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

Jeff Miller, of the Planning and Development Department, stated that two public hearings have been held, as required by the Grant, and the hearing today is the first of the final two required before the final application can be submitted for the Community Development Block Grant; that, due to insufficient time to prepare the application and advertise the public hearings, he requested that the Chairman be authorized to sign a letter to Housing and Urban Development requesting an extension of time (from August 30th) to permit submission of a full application by September 11, 1978; that the final public hearing has been scheduled for September 7th, at which time the Board will be requested to adopt a Resolution approving the application and forward same to HUD.

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Jean Seahaver made a presentation on two aspects of the application:

- 1) Housing Assistance Plan
- 2) Three-Year Community Development Strategy

outlining the aim and purpose of the Program.

Mr Miller stated that the Planning Department has received an invitation from HUD to submit application for the water system for Washington Park in the amount of \$216,000; and an alternate application for sewer system for Samoset in the amount of \$207,000. Upon question from Mr Fortson, he stated that the \$216,000 grant is to cover cost of construction.

D.E. Pittman, Director, Manatee County Utilities System, submitted figures on installation of proposed water system for Washington Park residents, estimating the total cost to serve 626 units at \$359,180, provided the connection fee is paid by grant money and the customer pays the \$50 service deposit. He also outlined methods by which the costs could be reduced by proportionately reducing the number of units to be served, and/or requiring the customer to pay the connection fee and deposit.

Following lengthy discussion, Mr Miller said he would contact Lawrence Livingston, (as representative of the Washington Park residents) and attempt to ascertain to what extent they would be willing to help defray the costs.

There was no one else to speak and the Chairman declared the public hearing closed.

Motion was made by Mr McClure that the letter be forwarded to HUD requesting an extension of time. Motion was seconded by Mr Fowinkle and carried unanimously.

GRANTS DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

Bob Fernandez submitted for approval, recommendations outlined in letter from Regis Chapman dated August 18, 1978.

- (1) CETA Title I On-the-Job Training Contract R-171 with Sarasota-Bradenton Airport to train a Safety-Security Specialist, 8/10/78-2/21/79, \$1,960.
- (2) CETA Title III, On-the-Job Training Contract No. H-III-007 with Manatee Mobile Homes to train Cabinetmaker, 8/10/78-6/13/79, \$3,500.

- (4) Project summaries for funding under the Community Services Trust Fund (in the amount of \$14,879, which must be matched by an equal amount contributed by the applicant for a total budget of \$29,758; one half in cash, one half in "in kind" services) The Board was requested to set the priority on proposed projects:
 - Manatee Council on Aging
 - Boys Clubs of Manatee County Inc
 - Manatee County Girls Club
 - Manatee County Community Mental Health Center

Neil Anderson, representing Senior Citizen group, requested consideration for a Job Counseling Program.

Jeannie Oliver, representing the Girls Club, submitted request for one half of the grant (\$7,439.50) due to the Girls Club inability to match more than this amount.

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George Polino, Executive Director, Boys' Clubs of Manatee County, Inc., submitted request for the other half of the grant (\$7,439.50).

Motion was made by Mr Fowinkle that \$7,439.50 of the Community Trust Fund be awarded the Girls Club, with a like amount to the Boys Clubs. Motion was seconded by Mr McClure and carried unanimously.

There were no objections to suggestion by Mr McClure that Bob Fernandez and Regis Chapman work with Mr Anderson (ref: employment/job counseling program for senior citizens) to find a counselor for this particular program from some other source.

- (5) Approval to begin final negotiation with the Florida Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services for Displaced Homemakers Project.

Chairman Driggers recommended Item 5 be deferred for further review.

Motion was made by Mr McClure to approve Items 1, 2 and 3, and defer Item 5. Motion was seconded by Mr Fowinkle and carried unanimously.

MANATEE COUNTY HOUSING AUTHORITY

Henry Gergowicz, Executive Director, Manatee County Housing Authority, submitted proposed Cooperation Agreement, and Resolution Authorizing Application for Preliminary Loan (for low rent public housing) stating that the application must be in Jacksonville by September 1, 1978.

The County Attorney summarized the Agreement, stating that it is basically to secure contract(s) with the federal government for loans and annual contributions covering one or more projects, of approximately one hundred units of low rent housing, (consisting of duplexes or triplexes) and to develop or acquire and administer such projects. He read the resolution which recites the need for such low-rent housing in the County and approving the application.

Following discussion, action was deferred to the following Thursday to afford the County Administrator an opportunity to review the documents and make recommendations.

PERSONNEL: CONSOLIDATION SHEETS

Upon motion by Mr Fortson, seconded by Mr Fowinkle, the Personnel Consolidation Sheets (New Hires, Salary Changes, Terminations and Miscellaneous/Travel Authority) were unanimously approved as submitted.

TRANSIT: BUS LEASE

Phil Davis, Director, Transportation Department, requested approval of a Short Term Lease Agreement with Florida Department of Transportation to lease one 1975 Twin Coach TC-31B, Transit Coach, through the month of November 1978, to be used as a support bus for the new Bayshore Route.

Motion was made by Mr McClure to approve the bus lease. Motion was seconded by Mr Fortson and carried unanimously.

JOINT PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT

BUDGET AMENDMENT - TRANSIT

In order to obtain final approval from UMTA and the State of Florida, and award the bid for sole source purchase of two 31-passenger buses from Blue Bird Bus Company, Mr Davis requested transfer of line item funds within the grant to make up the difference between the \$138,675.38 quoted by Blue Bird Bus Co. and the \$130,000 grant line item for bus purchase.

PURCHASING DEPARTMENT

In the absence of the Purchasing Director, recommendations of the Purchasing Department were submitted by the County Administrator.

SOUTH COUNTY LIBRARY

1. Carpeting
 - a. Advertise for bids

Motion was made by Mr Fowinkle to advertise for bids for carpeting for South County Library. Motion was seconded by Mr McClure and carried unanimously.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

2. Installation of Tower (East County)
 - a. Advertise for bids on:
 - 1) Transmitter House; 2) Basic Electrical Power;
 - 3) Chain Link Fence; 4) SKW Emergency Generator
 - 5) Barbed Wire Fence; 6) Telephone Installation;
 - 7) Culvert for Access 8) Paving

Ken McKendree, Emergency Medical Services Director, explained that these items, estimated to cost approximately \$12,375.00, are not funded in the grant, and requested additional funds in order to be able to go to bid.

The County Administrator recommended approval of items 1 through 6, and deferral of Items 7 & 8 (since culvert and paving could be accomplished through in-house work) until the following Thursday, at which time he would make recommendations to the Board.

Mr Fortson recommended, and moved to approve commencement of advertising for bids; and that he, Mr McKendree and Ralph Umana review the EMS budget prior to any commitment of funds. Motion was seconded by Mr Fowinkle and carried unanimously.

PARTICIPATION PROJECT NO. 1206 (PENDING NO. 54)

Bob Moon, Right of Way Agent, advised that Project No. 1206 (Pending No. 54), 60th Avenue Terrace West, meets the requirements as participation project, with 69 percent of the property represented by signatures of the owners.

Motion was made by Mr Fowinkle to accept the project, and authorize the County Engineer to proceed with the survey, plans and estimates. Motion was seconded by Mr Fortson and carried unanimously.

46TH COURT EAST (ACCEPTED)

Motion was made by Mr Fowinkle to accept 46th Court East by right of maintenance under Florida Statute 95.361. Motion was seconded by Mr Fortson and carried unanimously.

TALLEVAST ROAD (ACCEPTED)

Motion was made by Mr Fortson to accept Tallevast Road (from U.S. 301 to Lockwood Ridge Road) under Florida Statute 95.361. Motion was seconded by Mr Fowinkle and carried unanimously.

WARNER'S EAST BAYOU

James Wedle and Dan Hansen, attorney, submitted petition with signatures of twenty people with vested interest or property along Warner's East Bayou, requesting the County dredge and re-open the Bayou for navigation.

Mr Hansen stated that the silting problems apparently originated from a County drainage ditch along the southern and eastern edge of Harbor Woods Subdivision; that the county is responsible and should be obligated to maintain its drainage ditches.

He further stated that a private contractor (Midway Construction Co., Sarasota) has offered to perform the dredging operation at a cost of \$17,850; that the developer (Charles Parr) is willing to have spoils deposited on his land; that any permitting problems that have not already been resolved through the efforts of Mr Wedle can be handled within sixty to ninety days.

Following discussion, Mr McClure, in whose district the Bayou is located, recommended action be deferred until the County Engineer has an opportunity to listen to the tapes of this presentation; review the information and make his recommendations, after which Mr McClure will contact Mr Hansen and Mr Wedle. There were no objections.

ZONING

Charles Carrington, Director, and Bill Swan, Planner, submitted recommendations of the Planning Commission.

R-906 DWIGHT MEAD & JIM MORRISON REZONE TO R-3 - WITHDRAWN
Deferred 7/25/78 at request of applicant.

Mr Fortson advised that the petitioner had requested his petition be withdrawn, and he moved that R-906 be withdrawn as requested. Motion was seconded by Mr Fowinkle and carried unanimously.

SE-1134 KINDER CARE LEARNING CENTERS, INC - DEFERRED
Deferred 8/15/78 at request of Mr Fortson and that the agent be present to explain the proposed use.

Michael Phillips, representing Yorkmount Building and Development Corporation, owners of subject property, was present to answer any questions, and stated that Yorkmount had been contacted by Kinder Care to construct a building on this property, approximately 47000 square feet, which would accomodate a maximum of

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100 pre-school age children. Upon question, he further stated that the learning center would be open six days a week from approximately 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., twelve months a year.

Following discussion on placement of the building on the site, traffic on 25th Street W., and possible restriction of number of children allowed in the learning center, the Planning Director recommended deferral until the staff and the petitioner can resolve these problems, at which time he will submit recommendation to the Board for further consideration. There were no objections.

77-S-35(F) SHANNON PARK SUBDIVISION - APPROVED
Deferred 8/15/78, pending legal problems being resolved.

The County Attorney advised that all the legal problems have been resolved with the exception of the recording of the affidavit in connection with the Power of Attorney. (Security: Certificate No. 19473-8 dated August 3, 1978, issued by Inter-City National Bank to Albert P. Baudrit or Nancy Baudrit or Manatee County Board of County Commissioners and Certificate #19685-7 dated August 4, 1978 issued by Inter City National Bank to Albert P. Baudrit or John E. Jackson, to be held in escrow by the County)

Motion was made by Mr Fowinkle to approve final plat of Shannon Park Subdivision, subject to recording of affidavit referred to by the County Attorney. Motion was seconded by Mr Fortson and carried unanimously.

75-S-17(P) WOODS OF WHITFIELD UNIT 7 - APPROVED
Request: Preliminary plan approval of 58 single family lot subdivision on 20.4 acres, east of 9th Street E. and north of Nicholson Avenue.
Planning Commission recommended APPROVAL with waiver of recreation requirements.

Due to Nicholson Road being a shell road and source of potential dust problem, Mr Fowinkle recommended a buffer of trees be placed along this road. Ralph Nelson, representing the petitioner, agreed to this proviso.

Motion was made by Mr Fowinkle to approve the preliminary plan of Woods of Whitfield Unit 7, as recommended by the Planning Commission, and including a buffer of trees. Motion was seconded by Mr McClure and carried unanimously.

78-S-30(P&F) COURTNEY PLUM SUBDIVISION - APPROVED
Request: Preliminary and Final plat approval of 3 single family lots subdivision on 8 acres, bordered on the East by Center Road and approximately ½ mile North of 33rd St.
Planning Commission recommended APPROVAL with waiver of sidewalk and recreation requirements.

The County Attorney stated that the plat is in good legal form except that it has not been signed by the County Engineer.

Motion was made by Mr McClure to approve 78-S-30(P&F), subject to signature of the County Engineer. Motion was seconded by Mr Fowinkle and carried unanimously.

In connection with the expansion of Linger Lodge Travel Trailer Park, (which is in close proximity to Ward Lake Reservoir, water supply for City of Bradenton) Chairman Driggers stated that the City of Bradenton has requested to be notified prior to approval or issuance of any building permits.

Mr Carrington advised that Jerry West, City Planning Director, will be furnished a copy of the preliminary plan of Linger Lodge and invited to review applications involving this project.

WARRANT LISTS

Motion was made by Mr McClure to approve Warrant Lists from August 15th to August 22nd, 1978, and to authorize Warrant Lists to August 29, 1978, said Warrant Lists to include any payrolls during that period upon condition that all employees have performed their services in accordance with time and payroll practices of the County departments. Motion was seconded by Mr Fortson and carried unanimously.

AUDIT: CLERK OF CIRCUIT COURT (FORMER)

R.B. Shore, Clerk of Circuit Court, by letter dated August 22, 1978, submitted Audit #9317, the Audit of former Clerk of Circuit Court of Manatee County for period of March 1, 1975 through January 3, 1977.

Motion was made by Mr McClure to accept the Audit Report for the record. Motion was seconded by Mr Fowinkle and carried unanimously.

The County Attorney was given a copy of the report, instructed to research Florida Statute 17.041 referred to in Mr Shore's letter, and make recommendations back to the Board.

COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD - TAX MILLAGE

Commissioner Fortson expressed concern about information appearing in a recent newspaper article that the County School Board plans to reduce the tax millage by only .45 of a mill.

He recommended that, in conjunction with efforts by the Board of County Commissioners to hold taxes in line, a resolution or letter be sent to the County School Board expressing the Commission's concern regarding property reassessment and the effects that increased millage might have, and asking their Board to also take this into consideration when setting their millage.

Following discussion, the County Attorney and the County Administrator were instructed to draft a letter expressing the Commission's position and concern. It was agreed that a copy of the letter should be forwarded the cities and local Legislative Delegation.

SADDLEHORN ESTATES

By letter dated August 14, 1978, the County Engineer advised that, based on certification of Dale Haas, Engineer of Record for Saddlehorn Estates, and inspections by the Highway Department, he recommended that the streets and drainage improvements be accepted for County maintenance. He stated the developer will maintain the \$1,000 in existing escrow account for minor maintenance of this development to be completed after the rains have subsided.

Motion was made by Mr Fortson that Saddlehorn Estates be accepted for maintenance. Motion was seconded by Mr Fowinkle and carried unanimously.

FLORIDA SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF AND THE BLIND

Motion was made by Mr McClure and seconded by Mr Fowinkle, that the Chairman be authorized to sign appropriate forms certifying

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that Brian Reinoehl is a resident of Manatee County and entitled to free admission to the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind. Motion carried unanimously.

PHOSPHATE MINING: CONSULTANT/MONITOR

Chairman Driggers submitted request by O.E. Randle, Director, County Pollution Control, that the Board advise whether some one is to be employed for the purpose of reviewing environmental impact statements and other matters pertaining to mining applications, or if this should be handled by the Pollution Control Department personnel to the best of their ability.

Following discussion, Mr Randle's request was referred to the County Administrator for research and recommendations back to the Board.

HISTORICAL COMMISSION

Upon recommendation of G. Warren Johnson Jr, Chairman, Manatee County Historical Commission, motion was made by Mr Fowinkle, and seconded by Mr McClure, to accept resignation of John K. Anderson as a member of the Historical Commission, and appoint Mrs Clyde Perry to fill his unexpired term (to January 1, 1981). Motion carried unanimously.
