Discussion: Staff is reviewing five accesses; issues associated with each access; address public accesses in Master Plan for Cortez; etc.

Judicial Center

William R. Wheeler asked what the cost would be for the new judicial center and whether a sales tax would be necessary for funding.

Discussion: Accurate estimate not available as of yet; consultant looking at cost estimates and alternatives; the first meeting of the Judicial Center working group was just held, and three options were identified: (1) re-utilization of the existing site (Hensley Public Safety Complex); (2) demolition of the existing site with the cost of a new building; and (3) an option to be determined based on input gathered from everyone at the existing sites; associated costs and design concepts will be developed for the three options; information is expected to come back in four months; etc.

The Accord

Mr. Wheeler stated he was unable to find a copy of the Accord, an interlocal agreement among the County, the municipalities within the County, and the Manatee County School Board.

Mr. Padgett advised that the County is waiting for all the municipalities to sign the Accord, at which time it will be put on MGA (Manatee Government Access). Following discussion and without objection, the Accord will be put on MGA (and the County website) now.

TRAFFIC SIGNAL SYSTEM

Harry Mendenhall, Transportation Department, requested support for the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) to continue the study of an upgraded traffic signal control system (ITS – Intelligent Traffic System). Mr. Mendenhall noted that an upgraded system should result in savings in time, driver frustration, reduced air pollution, and increased fuel savings.

(Enter Mrs. von Hahmann)

Abdul Hamid, Post, Buckley, Schuh & Jernigan, Inc. (FDOT consultant), used a slide show to review the Sarasota-Manatee Signal Systems Alternatives Analysis completed for FDOT. He stated two Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) subcommittees reviewed three alternatives and recommended Alternative 3: an integrated ITS with regional traffic management center and video monitoring (cameras). Mr. Hamid noted that there have been discussions with Time-Warner Cable and Verizon, Inc., to determine cost savings in using private, fiber optic interconnect networks rather than installing a separate, publicly funded system.

(Enter Mr. Harris during presentation; Ms. Brown absent during portion of presentation)

Discussion: Whether system could lower costs of road improvements; projects in the Capital Improvements Program (CIP) that may benefit from the system; level of service improves with implementation of ITS; video monitoring could aid in incident management; cost-sharing, funding, and maintenance/operation costs; public education as to use of cameras; additional equipment to allow preemption by emergency vehicles at intersections; more evidence of level of service improvements; system would absorb funding for two years of transportation improvements; where system fits in budget priorities; cost of system has increased over \$20 million in three years; right-of-way costs not included in estimate; other costs, e.g., business damages; funding sources outside of CIP; funding ITS without affecting current projects; costs for road projects increase if delayed; assurance that use of cameras cannot be abused; etc.

Mr. Hamid addressed: Level of Service based on average speed with no change in traffic volume; information in the study from areas with ITS already installed; and components not in original study resulting in additional costs.

Motion was made by Mr. McClash to approve **Alternative 3** and request FDOT and the MPO to proceed with further study of the preliminary design of an upgraded countywide traffic signal system. The motion was seconded by Mr. Harris.

William Wheeler requested that the roadway be marked to indicate where motorists should stop in order to activate left turn arrows. **Bob Bartz** commended the Board on being a leader in infrastructure improvements.

The motion carried 6 to 0.

BRADEN WOODS - STOP SIGNS

Red Childs, Transportation Department, reviewed the request for multi-way stop signs at the intersection of Braden Run and Cypress Circle/Forrester Drive. Mr. Childs stated the studies by the Traffic Management Division indicated that multi-way stop signs were not warranted; therefore, he recommended denial.

Discussion: Fatalities at intersection not reflected in study; intersection is curvilinear and makes line of sight difficult; vehicles speed on these streets; pedestrian activity is not addressed in studies; etc.

Motion was made by Ms. Brown to approve the installation of multi-way stop signs at the intersection of Braden Run and Cypress Circle/Forrester Drive. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Glass and carried 6 to 0.

Richard Sulick, representing the Braden Woods Homeowners Association, showed photographs of an accident at the intersection, and used a map to point out the intersection at the southern end of Braden Run, which has multi-way stop signs.

Ms. Brown reiterated a request to expedite paving of 17th Street in Palmetto.

G. T. Brav Park

Mr. McClash advised that he received a letter from Steve Dye, Manatee Area Youth Soccer Organization (MAYSO), concerning remodeling the concession stand. Mr. Dye asked whether MAYSO could make payments on their share of the costs. Mr. McClash asked that this item be placed on an agenda for approval.

Discussion: County Administrator already working with Mr. Dye; agreement would need legal review; expedite agreement; etc.

Cuba Trip

Mr. McClash stated he visited Cuba last week, where he presented the Proclamation passed by the Board (12/11/01). Mr. McClash also noted that something similar to a community redevelopment district has been used to renovate Old Havana. He had pictures and videos of his visit to share with the Board.

PINEY POINT PHOSPHATE PLANT

Mr. Padgett requested approval of a draft letter to be signed by Congressman Dan Miller, requesting federal assistance to address the Piney Point phosphoric acid plant emergency treatment.

Charlie Hunsicker, Ecosystems Administrator, advised that the State of Florida will invest \$30 million to \$40 million to neutralize the processed water at the plant, allowing for discharge into Tampa Bay. The State has requested the Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) and the area governments find a use for this water rather than discharging it into Tampa Bay. Mr. Hunsicker stated the MARS Program would act as the conduit for this water product.

(Enter Ms. Brown)

Mr. Hunsicker stated a reservoir at the Florida Power & Light (FP&L) Parrish Plant could be used as a storage facility. Using a diagram, Mr. Hunsicker pointed out the locations of the Piney Point phosphate plant, the MARS pipeline, and the FP&L plant.

Motion was made by Ms. Brown, seconded by Mr. Harris, and carried 5 to 0, to approve the request.

Discussion: Manasota Basin Board will decide on proposed reuse of treated water for agricultural purposes; whether FP&L will use the water to generate power; replace water currently taken from Little Manatee River by FP&L (10-15 million gallons per day) with treated water from phosphate plant; FP&L water credits; FP&L has continuing consumptive use permits for its needs; rainfall will fill the stack at the phosphate plant until it can be capped and closed entirely in the next decade; etc.
