Harry Mendenhall, Transportation Department, stated that staff does not recommend the speed limit changes for Lakewood Ranch Boulevard, which is a major thoroughfare road. A speed study conducted at three locations on Lakewood Ranch Boulevard indicated that 85 percent of vehicles traveled at or below the average of 45 miles per hour (MPH).

Discussion: Additional traffic signals will be needed on Lakewood Ranch Boulevard; temporary traffic signal near Summerfield has not been replaced with a permanent signal; Summerfield residents support Lakewood Ranch Boulevard speed change; Lakewood Ranch developers request reduced speed for a consistent 35 mph speed limit along the entire boulevard; etc.

Gril Palmer, resident on 27th Street East, spoke in favor of reduced speed on 27th Street East as the street is narrow and the four-way stop is ignored. **John Moreland** requested 27th Street East be designated a no passing zone and that signs be posted in front of Wakeland Elementary School. Mr. Moreland was referred to the Transportation Director regarding corrective measures, e.g., striping the lanes, etc.

Mr. Mendenhall recommended denial of the request for **27th Street East** due to insignificant traffic study results, and the street being a designated thoroughfare with an industrial use in the area.

Discussion: Unresolved level of service designation with City of Bradenton regarding 27th Street East; County Planning Department calculations indicate a Level of Service F for 27th Street East; restricting truck travel on thoroughfare roadways; improvements on 27th Street East are needed; County can stripe 27th Street East; consider joint funding participation with the City; shifting the traffic problem to 15th Street East; 13th Avenue East turn is not functional for large trucks; etc.

(Mr. Harris absent for a portion of discussion)

Speaking in opposition to restricting truck traffic on 27th Street East were Ron Webb and Gril Palmer.

Timothy Powell spoke in favor of restricting truck traffic. He also complained that Waste Management garbage trucks are speeding on 27th Street East, as well as dropping garbage. The County Administrator was directed to contact Waste Management to relay the complaints.

Inez Ware requested the heavy vehicular traffic on 27th Street East be rerouted.

Motion - Letter to City of Bradenton

Following discussion, motion was made by Mr. McClash to authorize the Chairman to send a letter to the City requesting they work with County staff to make improvements to 27th Street East (i.e., a traffic signal with yellow flashing lights at night). Motion was seconded by Mr. Bruce and carried 7 to 0.

May Patterson spoke in favor of truck restrictions on 27th Street East.

Motion - Ordinance 02-54

Motion was made by Mr. McClash to adopt Ordinance **02-54** with <u>exclusion</u> of 27th Street East (as recommended by staff). Following discussion, the motion carried 6 to 1, with Ms. Brown voting nay.

TREE REMOVAL - VARIOUS PROJECTS

Joaquin Servia, Planning Department, stated several residents raised issues at the previous meeting (8/27/02) regarding removal of trees in the Ancient Oaks, Lexington (fka Meadowpond), and Whitney Meadows subdivisions. He gave an overview of each project subsequent to Board approval:

Whitney Meadows (Buskirk PDR-00-18[Z][P])

- Approved February 27, 2001, with Stipulations, none addressing tree removal/replacement
- Final site plan contained a detailed tree inventory and landscape plan

Mr. Servia displayed a site plan and photographs and stated that during the course of project construction, 20 palms and three oak trees along the right-of-way were removed. The trees were not part of the preserved plan, but were to remain. The new property owner was advised that a revised landscape plan showing replacement of the oak tree canopy is required.

Discussion: Tree replacement ratios should mirror Land Development Code (LDC) wetland mitigation ratios; LDC does not contain mechanism to address a penalty for violation of tree removal; staff requires on-site tree replacement versus a Tree Trust Fund contribution; require developer to replace the tree canopy on site even if it means losing buildable lots; base penalty factor on the value of the tree; LDC mitigation ratios for trees that are removed with a permit; rights-of-way and platted lots of record are exempt from tree protection under LDC; distinction between County right-of-way and underlying ownership of land; etc.

(Mrs. von Hahmann absent for a portion of discussion)

Mr. Servia stated that the oak tree at Lot 72 is actually sitting on Tract A, a landscape buffer area.

Erika Barrett, Planning Department, stated that the 42-inch oak tree at Lot 71 was discussed with the project agent and it was agreed the tree would be preserved.

Discussion: Ensure easements are in place for those trees that should be preserved; County ability to require a tree protection easement; a steep, on-site mitigation ratio for willful violators; draft an amendment to the LDC; etc.

Lexington (fka Meadowpond PDR-01-06[Z][P])

- Approved October 23, 2001, with Stipulations
- Stipulation 10 required a 25-foot roadway buffer along U.S. 301 to achieve 80 percent opacity and that existing indigenous vegetation remain to meet maximum buffering requirements
- Stipulation 31 ordered removal of all nuisance exotics and preservation of the oaks and wax myrtles within the 25 feet of additional right-of-way to be dedicated;
- Preliminary Site Plan and landscape plan were approved indicating existing tree groupings; neither Preliminary Site Plan nor landscape plan showed any trees to be removed

Using a site plan and slides, Mr. Servia stated that trees and vegetation were removed along 25 feet of the additional right-of-way to be dedicated. There was no tree survey, as none of the trees were slated for removal. A site check revealed trees and vegetation were removed within existing right-of-way, along with an undetermined quantity of exotics within additional right-of-way.

Discussion: Why a stop work order was not issued; vegetation content of right-of-way is unknown, as it was not included in the plans; observations were brought to staff's attention by nearby citizens; form a volunteer group to monitor projects; etc.

(Mrs. Glass absent for a portion of discussion)

Doug Means, Environmental Management Department, displayed an aerial map delineating the existing right-of-way line and area vegetation, which was not documented, other than by the aerial. A subsequent site check revealed a stockpile of materials consisting of mostly palms, along with wax myrtles, saw palmettos, and Brazilian peppers.

Discussion: Environmental Management does not monitor tree protection; tree protection is preservation/conservation; the area was cleared in order to install silt barriers; site plans and aerials indicate property boundaries but exclude rights-of-way; adding infrastructure sometimes necessitates tree removal; incorporate parameters at the design phase of preliminary approval; etc.

Ancient Oaks (DB Associates PDR-96-02[Z][G])

- Approved September 26, 1996
- Issues involve tree removal and a swale adjacent to agricultural property

Jerome Gostkowski, Planning Department, displayed photographs and an aerial map highlighting the swale, pond, wetland, and outfall structure at the northeast corner of the site. During project construction, a ditch block in the south end of the swale was removed and grading was done.

Dorothy Rainey, Planning Department, displayed a General Development Plan (GDP) and provided a chronological outline of the project, landscape buffer requirements, an analysis of tree surveys since 1996, and the total number of trees to be removed/replaced on site. She stated that the GDP showed "engineering intent" that no drainage design was specifically required by LDC Section 508.3.2. A standard, 15-foot greenbelt buffer was required. She highlighted areas where trees will be planted.

Discussion: Ratio of slope embankment; public and private improvements (landscaping) are bonded; Certificates of Occupancy cannot be issued until private improvements are installed; 176 cabbage palms were removed, but never depicted or documented on a tree survey; whether cabbage palms are considered trees; etc.

Ms. Rainey advised that the initial tree survey, based on an aerial, showed a total of 775 trees being removed, 239 of which were pines. The most recent survey (October 1991) broke out the total trees removed and to be planted into three phases. Overall totals counted 561 oaks, 18 pines, 7 other, and 1,347 cabbage palms, for a total of 1,933 to be removed. The new plan achieves replacement partially through relocation and replanting on site.

Debbie Massey, **Robert Mayhew**, **Valrie Massey**, and **Kim Anderson** commented on the number of trees removed, lack of buffering, and the slope of the swale. It was recommended that staff meet with the Masseys to review the slope plans and drainage swale. Debbie Massey questioned the point at which a site plan amendment becomes an administrative decision.

Bob Gause, representing Lexington subdivision, displayed directional photographs to address the issue of tree removal and stated that none of the vegetation was deliberately removed.

Discussion: Process was followed and intent was to preserve the trees; installation of silt barrier does not grant random tree removal; majority of tree removal occurred within the existing U.S. 301 right-of-way; Mr. Gause to bring back to the Board what the developer was committed to with regard to the screening plan and what has taken place since; etc.

Dave McNabb, representing Ancient Oaks, displayed photographs of the Ancient Oaks project and stated that the developer complied with the stipulations, and that extra effort was made to save trees.

IMPACT FEES – AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Fred Loveland, Community Services Director, reported on impact fees with respect to Manatee County's Affordable Housing Program, and the effect of impact fee increases on the affordable housing market (requested 8/20/02).

(Enter Mrs. von Hahmann and Mr. Bruce)

He advised that State Housing Initiative Partnership (SHIP) funds may be used to pay for impact fees for SHIP-eligible construction projects including replacement of single-family structures where there is an increase in the number of bedrooms, in-fill site development, and residential project development. Approximately \$13,000 of SHIP funding was reserved to offset the cost of impact fees for affordable housing projects during the 2001-02 SHIP funding cycle.
