Child And Family Well-Being System Coordination Program, Florida Department Of Health-Sarasota (Rank N/A)

 Member Tapp, made a motion to recommend requested current funding in the amount of \$62,817 for program standing N/A, Florida Department of Health- Sarasota, Child and Family Well-Being System Coordination Program. Rationale for recommendation: Vital program. Motion was seconded by Member Shingledecker.


The motion carried 10-0, with Member Smith absent.

Child Advocacy Center, Manatee Children’s Services, (Rank 1)

 Member Garafola, made a motion to recommend the requested increase in the amount of \$1,184,094 for program standing 1, Manatee Children’s Services, Child Advocacy Center. Rationale for recommendation: High Score Program, priority program, long standing program. Motion was seconded by Member Tapp.

Residential, Manatee Children’s Services (Rank 2)

 Member Shingledecker, made a motion to recommend the requested increase in the amount of \$519,262 for program standing 2, Manatee Children’s Services, Residential. Rationale for recommendation: High score program. Motion was seconded by Member Garafola.

 Member Garafola, made a motion to recommend the requested increase in the amount of \$270,000 for program standing 4, Foundation for Dreams, Dream Oaks Camp. Rationale for recommendation: High score program, Motion was seconded by Member Pierce.

CHILDREN'S THERAPY, EASTER SEALS SOUTHWEST FLORIDA (RANK 5)

Rationale for recommendation: High score program, helps keep children out of foster care. Motion was seconded by Member Gallagher.

NEMOURS READING BRIGHTSTART! EARLY LEARNING COALITION (11)

 Member Felton, made a motion to recommend the requested increase in the amount of \$263,327 for program standing 11, Early Children Coalition, Nemours Reading BrightStart! Rationale for recommendation: Priority program, strong Results. Motion was seconded by Member Pierce.


The motion carried 10-0, with Member Smith absent.

CHOSEN FAMILIES, PARENTING MATTERS (12)

 Member Gallagher, made a motion to recommend the requested increase in the amount of \$412,650 for program standing 12, Parenting Matters, Chosen Families. Rationale for recommendation: One-of-a-kind program, high success rate. Motion was seconded by Member Pierce.


The motion carried 10-0, with Member Smith absent.

SEXUAL ASSAULT (RAPE CRISIS) ADVOCACY AND CHILD THERAPY, CENTERSTONE OF FLORIDA, INC (13)

 Member Shingledecker, made a motion to recommend the requested increase in the amount of \$134,218 for program standing 13, Centerstone of Florida, Inc., Sexual Assault (Rape crisis) Advocacy and Child Therapy. Rationale for recommendation: High score program, provides critical services. Motion was seconded by Member Brownell.

PARENT PARTNER PROGRAM, PARENTING MATTERS (14)

 Member Felton, made a motion to recommend the requested increase in the amount of \$515,992 for program standing 15, Step Up Suncoast, Healthy Families. Rationale for recommendation: Priority program, strong results. Motion was seconded by Member Garafola.


The motion carried 10-0, with Member Smith absent.

ALTERNATIVE PATH TO SUCCESS (APS), NEXT GENERATION ACADEMICS, INC (16)

 Member Pierce, made a motion to recommend level funding in the amount of \$95,000 for program standing 16, Next Generation Academics, Inc., Alternative Path to Success (APS). Rationale for recommendation: Unique program, long standing program. Motion was seconded by Member Shingledecker.

FAMILY PRESERVATION AND REUNIFICATION PROGRAM, SAFE CHILDREN COALITION (17)

 Member Gallagher, made a motion to recommend the requested increase in the amount of \$408,729 for program standing 17, Safe Children Coalition, Family Preservation and Reunification Program. Rationale for recommendation: High score program, success in returning families. Motion was seconded by Member Shingledecker.


The motion carried 10-0, with Member Smith absent.

MORNING CARE, AFTER SCHOOL, CAMP, MYAKKA, MYAKKA CITY COMMUNITY CENTER (18)

 Member Felton, made a motion to recommend requested level funding in the amount of \$132,002 for program standing 18, Myakka City Community Center, Morning Care, After School, Camp Myakka. Rationale for recommendation: Services are unique to the community. Motion was seconded by Member Tapp.


The motion carried 10-0, with Member Smith absent.

FAMILY SHELTER SERVICE WITH CASE MANAGEMENT, THE SALVATION ARMY (19)

 Member Tapp, made a motion to recommend requested level funding in the amount of \$110,210 for program standing 19, The Salvation Army, Family Shelter Service with Case Management. Rationale for recommendation: Only family shelter in Manatee County, high score program. Motion was seconded by Member Shingledecker.


The motion carried 10 -0, with Member Smith absent.

CHILDREN'S COMMUNITY ACTION TREATMENT (CAT) TEAM, CENTERSTONE OF FLORIDA, INC (20)

 Member Shingledecker, made a motion to recommend the requested increase in the amount of \$916,403 for program standing 20, Centerstone of Florida Inc., Children's Community Action Treatment (CAT) Team. Rationale for recommendation: High score program, provides critical service. Motion was seconded by Member Felton.

The motion carried 10-0, with Member Smith absent.

ONE TO ONE MENTORING PROGRAM, BIG BROTHER BIG SISTER OF THE SUNCOAST (21)

 Member Felton, made a motion to recommend the requested increase in the amount of \$337,500 for program standing 21, Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Suncoast, One to One Mentoring Program. Rationale for recommendation: Priority program, well received in community. Motion was seconded by Member Garafola.

Discussion ensued regarding the reason for a large increase is additional staff and additional children to serve, expanding the program and adding new programs, cost per child.


The motion carried 6-4, with Members Laughrey, Pierce, Shingledecker and Chairperson Bailey voting nay, and Member Smith absent.

Member Gallagher made a motion to reconsider recommendations for requested increase in the amount of 337,500 for Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Suncoast, One to One Mentoring Program. Motion was seconded by Chairperson Bailey and carried 10-0 with Member Smith absent.

Motion was amended by Member Gallagher and seconded by Member Shingledecker, to recommend level funding with a 7 percent increase in the amount of \$235,935 and not the amount of increase requested by the agency. Rationale: High score program, needed in the community.


The motion carried 6-4, with Members Brownell, Mitchell, Felton and Garafola noting nay, and Members smith absent.

 Member Felton, made a motion to recommend the requested increase amount of \$212,869 for program standing 23, Step Up Suncoast, Parents as Teachers. Rationale for recommendation: unique program, high scoring program, works well with other agencies. Motion was seconded by Member Garafola.

 Member Tapp, made a motion to recommend the requested increase amount of \$545,346 for program standing 25, United Community Centers Inc., Before and After School, Summer Enrichment Plus (BASE+). Rationale for recommendation: high score program, helps many children. Motion was seconded by Member Pierce

YOUTH HEALTHCARE COURT, CENTERSTONE OF FLORIDA, INC (26)

 Member Felton, made a motion to recommend the requested increase amount of \$248,722 for program standing 26, Centerstone of Florida Inc., Youth Healthcare Court. Rationale for recommendation: Priority Program, unique program. Motion was seconded by Member Garafola.

 Member Felton, made a motion to recommend the requested increase amount of \$187,250 for program standing 28, Feeding Empty Little Tummies, Weekend Meals. Rationale for recommendation: Provides Critical Service, important program for the community. Motion was seconded by Member Shingledecker.

Children's Health (CATCH). Rationale for recommendation: Priority program, high score program, high success rate. Motion was seconded by Member Shingledecker.

MENTORING MATTERS: IMPACTS OVER OBSTACLES, TAKE STOCK IN CHILDREN OF MANATEE COUNTY (30)

 Member Felton, made a motion to recommend the requested increase amount of \$107,000 for program standing 30, Take Stock in Children of Manatee County, Mentoring Matters: Impacts over Obstacles. Rationale for recommendation: strong program with a history of consistently meeting their results. Motion was seconded by Member Garafola.

COMMUNITY EFFORT TO REDUCE TRUANCY BY ASSESSING INDIVIDUALIZED NEEDS (CERTAIN), FAMILY RESOURCES, INC (31)

 Member Pierce, made a motion to recommend the requested increase amount of \$413,385 for program standing 31 Family Recourses Inc., Community Effort to Reduce Truancy by Assessing Individualized Needs (CERTAIN). Rationale for recommendation: strong results. Motion was seconded by Member Shingledecker.

THE COORDINATED APPROACH TO CHILD HEALTH (CATCH), EARLY LEARNING COALITION (32)

 Member Felton, made a motion to recommend the requested increase amount of \$171,735 for program standing 32, Early Learning Coalition, The Coordinated Approach to Child Health (CATCH). Rationale for recommendation: Important program for the community, unique program. Motion was seconded by Member Shingledecker.

EARLY CARE AND EDUCATION CHILD CARE SUBSIDY AND MATCH PROGRAM, EARLY LEARNING COALITION (33)

EMERGENCY BABY BASKETS, MEALS ON WHEELS OF MANATEE (43)

GIRLS ALTERNATIVE PROGRAM FOR SUCCESS (GAPS), JUST FOR GRILS (46)


 Member Garafola, made a motion to recommend requested level funding in the amount of \$858,540 for program standing 46, Just for Girls, Girls Alternative Program for

Success (GAPS). Rationale for recommendation: Priority program. Motion was seconded by Member Pierce.

Discussion ensued regarding concerns with finances, program being out of compliance, increases year after year, at risk girls with behavior health issues, lack of communication.


The motion failed 1-9, with Members Pierce, Felton, Gallagher, Garafola, Laughrey, Mitchell, Shingledecker, Tapp, and Chairperson Bailey voting nay, and Member Smith absent.

YOUTH INTERVENTION SERVICES, SAFE CHILDREN COALITON (47)

 Member Shingledecker, made a motion to recommend the requested increase amount of \$308,796 for program standing 47, Safe Children Coalition, Youth Intervention Services. Rationale for recommendation: Priority program, unique program. Motion was seconded by Member Felton.


The motion carried 10-0, with Member Smith absent.

 TEEN HEALTH EDUCATORS -RESULTS FIRST, HEALTHY TEENS INC (48)
