ORDINANCE NO. 79-2

AN ORDINANCE OF MANATEE COUNTY, FLORIDA, PROHIBITING THE STOPPING, STANDING OR PARKING OF MOTOR VEHICLES ON CERTAIN COUNTY-MAINTAINED STREETS IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREA OF MANATEE COUNTY, FLORIDA; PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE ORDINANCE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MANATEE COUNTY, FLORIDA:

In order to promote the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Manatee County, Florida, the following Ordinance is hereby enacted:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to stop, stand or park a motor vehicle upon any portion of the north side of the right-of-way of 55th Avenue West from the intersection of 55th Avenue West with U. S. Highway 41 (14th Street West) to the intersection of 55th Avenue West with 16th Street West, and upon any portion of the south side of the right-of-way of 55th Avenue West from the intersection of 55th Avenue West with U. S. Highway 41 (14th Street West) to the intersection of 55th Avenue West and 16th Street West.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to stop, stand or park a motor vehicle upon any portion of the north side of the right-of-way of 63rd Avenue West from the intersection of 63rd Avenue West with U. S. Highway 41 (14th Street West) to the intersection of 63rd Avenue West with U. S. 13th Street West, and upon any portion of the south side of the right-of-way of 63rd Avenue West from the intersection of 63rd Avenue West with U. S. 13th Street West.

Section 3. The Manatee County Highway Department shall erect appropriate NO PARKING and NO STOPPING signs in conspicuous locations within the right-of-ways designated within Section 1 and Section 2 of this Ordinance.

Section 4. Any person violating the terms of this Ordinance shall be deemed to have committed a misdemeanor and shall be penalized as provided for by the general laws of the State of Florida.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon the receipt of the official acknowledgement from the office of the Secretary of State of the State of Florida that this Ordinance has been filed with that office.
