

ORDINANCE 12-18

AN ORDINANCE OF MANATEE COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING SECTION 2-22-22 OF THE MANATEE COUNTY CODE; INSTITUTING AND CREATING AN ADDITIONAL NO STOPPING, STANDING OR PARKING ZONE TO INCLUDE PORTIONS OF POST BOULEVARD AND 59TH AVENUE EAST; REQUIRING THE ERECTION OF APPROPRIATE SIGNS; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes § 316.008, authorizes the Board of County Commissioners of Manatee County to regulate the stopping, standing or parking of motor vehicles upon streets and highways within the County's jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the County is desirous of amending its existing ordinances in order to provide for more effective and uniform enforcement as regards stopping, standing or parking of motor vehicles within County rights-of-way, all in furtherance of the public safety and welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Board of County Commissioners of Manatee County, Florida, that:

Section 1. Manatee County Code § 2-22-22 be amended to add the following no parking zones:

POST BOULEVARD From State Rd 70 to 59th Avenue East (Both sides of the road)

59TH AVENUE EAST From Post Blvd. to 500 feet west (Both sides of the road)

Section 2. The county administration is hereby directed to erect, modify and/or remove any appropriate signs to implement the zone changes created by this ordinance.

Section 3. Section 1 of this Ordinance shall be codified at Manatee County Code § 2-22-22.

Section 4. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provision of this Ordinance is held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected by such invalidity.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon being filed with the Office of the Secretary of State of the State of Florida.
