A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MANATEE COUNTY, FLORIDA, ACCEPTING A NATIONAL ENDOWMENTS OF HUMANITIES GRANT FOR CREATED EQUAL: AMERICA'S CIVIL RIGHTS STRUGGLES; AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR OR HIS DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE ALL APPROPRIATE DOCUMENTS RELATED TO GRANT ACCEPTANCE; AND AUTHORIZING THE NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES DEPARTMENT DIRECTOR OR DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE ALL APPROPRIATE DOCUMENTS REQUIRED IN CONNECTION WITH GRANT ADMINISTRATIVE FUNCTIONS.

WHEREAS, Manatee County has determined that submission and acceptance of a National Endowments of Humanities Created Equal: America's Civil Rights Struggles Grant is in the best interests of the health and welfare of the citizens of Manatee County.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MANATEE COUNTY, FLORIDA, THAT:

1. The acceptance of a National Endowments of Humanities film set and grant in the amount of \$1,200 is hereby authorized.
2. The County Administrator or his designee is authorized to execute all necessary documents with regards to acceptance of this grant.
3. The Neighborhood Services Department Director or her designee is authorized to execute all appropriate documents which may be required in connection with the administrative functions of this grant.

RESOLUTION B-14-052
AMENDING THE ANNUAL BUDGET
FOR MANATEE COUNTY, FLORIDA
FOR FISCAL YEAR 2013-2014

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes 129.06, authorizes the Board of County Commissioners to amend its budget for the current fiscal year as follows:

- a) Appropriations for expenditures in any fund may be decreased and other appropriations in the same fund correspondingly increased, provided the total appropriations of the fund are not changed.
- b) Appropriations from reserves may be made to increase the appropriation for any particular expense in the same fund, or to create an appropriation in the fund for any lawful purpose.
- c) Unanticipated revenues, including increased receipts for enterprise or proprietary funds, may be appropriated for their intended purpose, and may be transferred between funds to properly account for the unanticipated revenue.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Manatee County, Florida that the 2013-2014 budget is hereby amended in accordance with FS 129.06 as described on the attached summary and specified in the budget adjustment batch files which are listed below:

Description: Appropriates \$1,200 from the National Endowment of Humanities, Created Equal: Americas Civil Rights Struggle grant. The grant is being accepted along with this budget amendment as specified in the grant agreement being presented to the Board of County Commissioners on April 22, 2014.
