FINAL ORDER OF MANATEE COUNTY HEARING OFFICER KELLY FERNANDEZ ON BEHALF OF MANATEE COUNTY GRANTING SPECIAL PERMIT NO. SP-22-02 FOR Α SCATTER GARDEN. MONUMENT/MEMORIAL SPACE, AND ASSOCIATED PARKING AND INFRASTRUCTURE AT THE EXISTING **MEMPHIS CEMETERY ON THE APPROXIMATELY 3.97** ACRE PARCEL ZONED RSF-4.5 (RESIDENTIAL SINGLE-FAMILY 4.5 DWELLING UNITS PER ACRE) LOCATED SOUTH OF 25TH STREET WEST AND WEST OF US-41 N. COMMONLY KNOWN AS 201 25TH STREET WEST, PALMETTO (MANATEE COUNTY); PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Manatee County adopted the Manatee County Land Development Code (LDC), Manatee County Ordinance 15-17, as amended; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the LDC, Manatee County Ordinance 15-17, as amended, the Hearing Officer has the authority to grant Special Permits; and

WHEREAS, Manatee County requested a Special Permit to allow a scatter garden, monument/memorial space, and associated parking and infrastructure at the existing Memphis Cemetery; and

**WHEREAS,** on December 21, 2022, the aforementioned Hearing Officer held a public hearing to receive the staff report, applicant, and public comment, and argument regarding the proposed Special Permit.

NOW, THEREFORE, after consideration of the application for Special Permit 22-02 requested by Manatee County, the Hearing Officer makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and issues the Final Order as follows:

<u>Section 1. Findings of Fact.</u> The aforementioned Hearing Officer, after considering comment, argument, evidence, documentation and staff report presented, as well as all other matters presented at the Public Hearing above referenced, hereby makes the following Findings of Fact:

- A. The site is in the RSF-4.5 (Residential Single Family 4.5 dwelling units per acre) zoning district.
- B. The site is in the RES-6 (Residential-6 dwelling unit per acre) Future Land Use Category.

- C. The request is to approve a Special Permit to allow a scatter garden, monument/memorial space, and associated parking and infrastructure at the existing Memphis Cemetery.
- D. The overall site lies in Zones X FIRM Panel 12081C0162F, effective 8/10/2021.

<u>Section 2. Conclusions of Law</u>. Based upon the prior Findings of Fact and considering the testimony, evidence, documentation and the staff report presented, and a review of the applicable provisions of the Manatee County Comprehensive Plan and Manatee County LDC, the above referenced Hearing Officer hereby makes the following Conclusions of Law:

- A. This Hearing Officer has jurisdiction over the parties and subject matter in this proceeding pursuant to the LDC.
- B. The applicant has the burden of proving entitlement to the Special Permit it seeks. <u>Irvine v. Duval Cty Planning Commission</u>, 495 So.2d 167 (Fla. 1986); <u>Florida Department of Transportation v. J.W.C. Company, Inc.</u>, 396 So.2d 778 (Fla. 1st DCA 1981).
- C. The proposed use is consistent with the Manatee County Comprehensive Plan, including Policy 2.2.1.12.2 which list public and semi-public uses in the range of potential uses in the RES-6 (Residential-6) Future Land Use Category, and Policy 2.1.2.7 which requires review for all proposed development for compatibility and appropriate timing.
- D. The proposed use is in compliance with the Manatee County LDC, including Section 316.6 (Special Permit Review Criteria), and Section 531.11 (Cemeteries (including Human and Pet)).
- E. The proposed use will not be detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety or general welfare.
- F. The proposed use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding properties for uses permitted in the zoning district.
- G. Adequate measures will be taken to provide ingress and egress to the proposed use in a manner that minimizes traffic congestion in the public streets.
- H. The use, as proposed, is compatible with the surrounding uses and the general desired character of the area (height, bulk, scale, intensity, traffic, noise, drainage, lighting, and appearance).
- I. Development of the proposed use will not have a substantial adverse effect on a known archaeological, historical or cultural resource located on or off

the parcel proposed for development as there are no known resources located on or near the subject site.

- J. Adequate provisions have been made for screening and buffers to improve compatibility and harmony of the proposed uses and structures with the uses and structures of adjacent and nearby properties.
- K. The proposed use will not have a significant adverse effect on the natural environment, including land, air, water, wetlands, minerals, flora, fauna, and ambient noise.

<u>Section 3. Order</u>. Based upon the foregoing, a Special Permit is hereby approved and issued to Manatee County to allow a scatter garden, monument/memorial space, and associated parking and infrastructure at the existing Memphis Cemetery located on a parcel south of 25th Street West and west of US-41 N, commonly known as 201 25 Street West in Palmetto, as more particularly described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein, subject to the following conditions:

#### A. DESIGN AND LAND USE STIPULATIONS

- This Special Permit shall not be effective until it has been recorded in the Public Records of Manatee County, Florida, by the applicant and a copy of the recorded Order is received by the Building and Development Services.
- 2. The site plan submitted with this application will be part of this approval. Administrative approval by Manatee County of a Final Site Plan will be required subsequent to the approval of this Special Permit.

### **B. ENVIRONMENTAL**

- 1. All other applicable state or federal permits shall be obtained prior to commencement of development.
- 2. There are no impacts to jurisdictional wetlands or wetland buffers being approved by the adoption of this Ordinance. No wetlands exist on site.
- 3. If wells are encountered, a Well Management Plan for the proper protection and abandonment of existing wells shall be submitted to the EPS for review and approval prior to recommencing construction activities. The Well Management Plan shall include the following information:
  - Digital photographs of the well along with nearby reference structures (if existing);
  - GPS coordinates (latitude/longitude) of the well;
  - The methodology used to secure the well during construction (e.g. fence, tape);
  - The final disposition of the well used, capped, or plugged.

 Irrigation for landscaping shall use the lowest water quality source available, which shall be identified on the Final Site Plan. Use of Manatee County public potable water supply shall be prohibited.

#### C. UTILITIES

1. If any utility connections are to be made, connection to the County potable water and wastewater systems is required pursuant to the Manatee County Comprehensive Plan. The cost of connection, including the design, permitting and construction of off-site extensions of lines, shall be the responsibility of the Applicant. Such off-site extension shall be designed and constructed in accordance with the appropriate County Master Plan. The connection shall be designed, engineered and permitted by the Applicant consistent with Manatee County Public Works Standards and approved by County Engineer through the construction plans review process for the project.

<u>Section 4. Severability</u>. In the event that any portion or section of this Order is determined to be invalid, illegal or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decisions shall in no manner affect the remaining portions or sections of the Special Permit which shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. Effective Date. The effective date of this Special Permit shall be upon execution of this Order and its recordation in the Official Records by the applicant with the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court and receipt of a copy of the recorded Order by the Building and Development Services Department.
